SHELSELY WALSH HILL CLIMB ATTRACTS THE STARS

There's plenty of activity at the Hill Climb this summer. You may already have spotted Philip Glenister, the star of BBC's Ashes to Ashes series and Life on Mars when he visited the hill climb as part of Channel 4s new series For The Love Of Cars which was broadcast last month.

Car fanatic Philip spent the day at the Shelsley Walsh Hill Climb driving an MG-TC up to almost 70 miles per hour at the oldest motor sport venue in the country.

But the climb is not just for the stars and the MAC Breakfast Club is held once a month, with the next meeting on 15th June. The Breakfast Club is open to all, whether you are a car enthusiast, member of the club, motorsport mad or just like going out and meeting friends. As well as seeing a wide variety of cars old and new, you can also see the restored water mill in action, walk the hill and visit the Yard of Tarmac.

One of the highlights of the hill climb calendar is the *Classic Nostalgia event* on the 19th and 20th July.

The annual event attracts a wide range of competing cars from the 1950s and 60s and spectacular vehicle displays in both the paddock and orchard.

Visitors are encouraged to wear period dress, with prizes awarded on the Sunday for the best vintage outfits.

The courtyard stage will host entertainment throughout the weekend, including vintage-inspired musicians, and a ukulele band. Other entertainment includes Dance at 8, Lindy Hoppers and the Blitz Buddies dancers.

The paddock and orchard will be packed with competition cars, trade stands, military vehicles, car clubs, and even a classic car trial. Thrilling the crowds this year, will be an aerobatic display (weather permitting – Sunday only).

Sir Stirling Moss OBE will be guest of honour on the Sunday. Aside from regular autograph sessions, Sir Stirling will take part in a question and answer session in the courtyard.

SUPERFAST BROADBAND

As you are probably aware Worcestershire County Council has signed a contract with BT to provide improved rural broadband speeds. The work is being carried out in phases and in order to be included in an early phase residents must have registered on the WCC website their interest in receiving this faster broadband. Abberley and Great Witley are in the first phase – this is because between 50-60% of residents registered.

The percentage of registrations for Clifton is currently at 13%. This direct registration has now closed but you may still be able to improve the position if you register on http://www.superfastworcestershire.com/when-and-where/register. This registration actually says it will keep you notified when faster broadband will be with us but I am assured by the team that they will take note of any registrations received. It is very simple only your name and address details are required.





Church Matters

TAKING TIME OUT!

During these summer months it is usual for us to take some time out for a break. Commonly called our "annual holidays" or maybe "The Vacation" or if we felt guilty about taking a holiday we might say simply we are on "Annual leave"! Whatever we refer to it as, it is a well earned rest and hopefully a time of refreshment.

Holidays to some mean a time in the sun on a beach but to many it is about travelling to a place of particular interest such as the ancient ruins of Greece or perhaps even to a rainforest in South America. Such travels were foreseen by the prophet Daniel in the Old Testament who when looking into the future said "Many will go here and there to increase knowledge (Daniel 12 v.4). This was at a time when a journey had to have a purpose I am sure but nonetheless great distances were travelled. On a recent visit to Tarragona in Spain there was evidence of Paul's visit there on one of his journeys the purpose of which was to tell of the good news of Jesus which indeed entailed some travelling distance from the Middle East.

One thing was as certain to Paul as it can be to us today however and that is that the presence of God travelled with him as he held on to the promise of Jesus who said "Lo I am with you always even to the end of the age" (Mathew 28 v.20).

Our travels and journeys in life may well not be without their troubles and difficulties but with that promise and assurance to trust in we can gain a peace in whatever circumstances we face and a belief that all will be well in the end. We trust you have a good holiday and return safely well refreshed!

ST KENELM'S CHURCH YARD

As you may have read, progress on St Kenelm's Extension Church Yard has been slow because of drainage issues. When these have been resolved, we believe we will receive Planning Permission for full burials there. But meanwhile we are encountering a real shortage of space in the present Churchyard. We had thought we had space for a row, but recent interments have revealed the presence of old, unmarked graves, alongside. So we can go no further along that line unless we re-use ancient graves. This is being done in several parishes now, and it is perfectly legal after 75 years have elapsed since the first burial. But, of course, not everyone will be comfortable with such an arrangement.

Looking around the Church Yard with our new knowledge, it seems to us that there may be no space left for a brand new grave. We therefore respectfully advise Parishioners that we cannot guarantee that any new grave in the present Churchyard would be free of a previous burial. This does not affect the interment of Cremated Remains, for which there is still room.

TOWER TROUBLE AT ST. KENELM'S

Growing concern over widening cracks in the 800year-old tower of St. Kenelm's church in Clifton has prompted a structural survey. This has shown that the walls of the tower are continuing to lean outwards little by little. Two ties were inserted in previous centuries, and 6 new ties are now recommended by the structural report.

These modern ties will not be visible from the outside but they will of course run into several thousands of pounds.

"Though we can probably meet the bill by raiding reserves," says the Revd John Sumner, "we are appealing to everyone in the parish, whether they are churchgoers or not, to help us. We need to save both this beautiful building and the ministry of a local vicar, however part-time, for future generations. Our target is to raise £14,000 in donations each year and we are partly on our way. I am hopeful that the generosity of those who live here can achieve the target."

Whit Sunday - Pentecost

Once everybody knew when Whit Sunday was, because there was a Bank Holiday Monday attached to it. But then the Bank Holiday was fixed and Pentecost moves around like Easter.

In the old, old days, Pentecost was a big thing in most villages. You would have fetes or dancing or processions. Children dressed up in white and went for long rambles.(hence the name Whit Sunday).

It's still a very important time for the church because in a sense it is when it all started, with the coming of the Holy Spirit after Jesus' resurrection and ascension.

This year it is on June 8th, and at St Kenelm's we are hoping to welcome most of our Uniformed Organisations to a great service. It will be a Family Communion – an opportunity for young people to experience a communion service, which is at the centre of many adults worship. Anyone who is not confirmed will be welcome to come to the rail for a blessing.

Just as we did at Easter, there will be craft activities available for younger children. So this is a grand mixture of seriousness and celebration. And the celebrations will continue on the rectory lawn afterwards with 3-legged races etc.

MID-SUMMER FLOWERS AND GARDENS

St Kenelm's are planning great things for the mid-summer weekend, Saturday 21st and Sunday 22nd June.

In the church there will be floral displays and for some of the time, refreshments. Each day there will be a "Hidden Gardens Trail" where parishioners are opening their beautiful private gardens for us to enjoy, all in support of St Kenelm's.

Please note that this is not the National Gardens Scheme or the National Trust! Each day there will be about 10 gardens open reflecting many different styles of beauty. But nobody has been asked to remove all the weeds especially for us – what we are offering is charm and in some cases lovely views.

On the Saturday gardens are outside the village. A guided tour of the trail will start at 11am, but you can turn up later and go around individually if you prefer. (This trail does involve crossing the B road twice and there will be marked crossing points for safety).

On the Sunday most gardens will be within the village itself and the trail from church starts at 11.30am. For people who do not wish to walk the whole trail, the programme will suggest where to park.

Entry is by programme, which are bought in the church costing £5.50 for one day or £8 for both days. Children of primary school age and under are free. If you prefer to visit just one or two, the charge is £2 per garden.

Some of the gardens include interesting extras such as a model railway, a treasure hunt or croquet. Teas are available in one garden. (Donations will be asked for these extra things).

Gardens Trail Organiser Alice Sumner says "we want to make this FUN for all the family, as well as beautiful and enthralling".








TEME VALLEY WILDLIFE

The Teme Valley Wildlife Group was founded just over six years ago in 2008. The first meeting was held around a dining room table and hosted just eight people. Since then, the Group has grown, almost month on month, such that, there are now over 80 signed up members. We regularly have attendances at the indoor meetings of 40 – 50 people, where visiting speakers come to talk about a range of wildlife related subjects. The email circulation list has some 250+ contact addresses, meaning that over the years, this number of people have had direct communication with the Group. In fact, the total is far higher, as many of these email addresses cover not just an individual, but couples and indeed families. So the Teme Valley Wildlife Group has become an integral part of the local community, working without borders or parishes.

During the past six years, the activities of the Group have diversified. We have run 'Bug Hunts' with some of the local schools, guides, charities, churches and library club groups. We have run bat detecting evenings, moth trapping / recording sessions and pond surveys, as well as having an active monthly wildlife walk program, where members meet to do a local walk and perhaps see the Teme Valley, from a different view point.

The Teme Valley, which was prior to the Group's set up, the most under recorded area within Worcs and Shropshire, is now well and truly on the map. The Group members have recorded a plethora of flora and fauna hitherto, unknown in these parts of the counties. Eight and one new moth species have turned up in the Teme Valley which were completely new records for Worcs and Shropshire respectively. Greater Broomrape, a parasitic plant living in close proximity of broom and only known about on one other site in Worcs, was found in the heart of the Valley. And whilst we are very fortunate to have the rare Great Crested Newt in many of our local ponds, (so commonly seen that it doesn't feel like a national rarity!), the presence of all three UK newt species present in one pond was, up to the time of our local pond survey, only known about in just one pond in the south of Worcs. Our survey put another four ponds in that category, where all three newt species were found co-existing in the same water.

So much has happened during this time and most of it driven by the enthusiasm of a very active committee. A new committee gets elected every two years and as such, the Group elected a new committee at the recent April AGM. The first task of any new committee is to elect its new officers. With Danny Arnold looking to step down from the position of Chairman, a post he has held since the Group was formed, we are absolutely delighted to announce that the new Chairman of the Group, is Sheila Benbow.

TEME VALLEY WILDLIFE (CONTINUED)

Sheila takes the chair having been on the committee for several years and who has been instrumental in moving the Group forward within the community. We very much look forward to her leadership and direction. Our new Secretary is Dr Stephanie Mocroft and as of next month, Steph will also be taking over the mantle for writing the monthly wildlife editorial in the parish magazines. This will give a fresh new perspective on wildlife in the Teme Valley. Our Treasurer is Nick Benbow, a position held and expertly administered by him for the past few years. And finally, there is a big welcome to Geoff Wookey who will be sitting in the Vice Chairman's seat.

The next indoor meeting of the Wildlife Group is on **Thursday 12th June** when we welcome back to the Group, **Rebecca Lashley** who is an Environmental Projects Officer with Worcestershire County Council. Rebecca will be talking about the Worcestershire Orchards Project. The meeting is at Rochford Village Hall, 7:30pm and as always, its just £2 on the door where everybody is most welcome.

All Councillors present plus County Councillor K Pollock, Mrs J Dale (Clerk) and 35 members of the public. 2 representatives from Greenlight Developments and the landowner.

Election of Chairman/Vice Chairman: Cllr Pound was re-elected as Chairman and Cllr Newman as Vice Chair. **Apologies:** District Councillor G Farmer sent apologies.

Public Question Time: A parishioner raised the condition of some of the pavements in the village. Cllr Pollock replied that he had requested repairs to the pavement opposite the shop. Replacement tree seat – to be followed up. Replacement footpath officer – Cllr Bradley has this in hand. Matt Gallagher of Greenlight Developments talked about the proposals to build a further 48 houses on Blue Shot Meadow. Outline planning application will be submitted mid June, they would be on site May 2015 with completion in approximately 18 months. Section 106 funds would be for recreation in Clifton on Teme. The parishioners present made it very clear that they are against any further development. Greenlight Developments will be holding a public consultation in the Village Hall on May 20th.

County Councillor Report: Cllr Pollock reported on the financial situation and how WCC were trying to expand Act Local by commissioning certain schemes to local solutions. He reported on rural broadband and that Clifton on Teme had made a poor response in registering for faster broadband.

Bus services are still under review and results would be available mid June. He gave details of the improved on-line reporting system. Additional housing - he mentioned that at a recent public meeting on a proposal for Great Witley, District Cllr Paul Cumming observed that the villages covered by the SWDP had already absorbed their fair share of any proposed developments, and that any further should be resisted by the Council and the Planning Inspector. (Cllr Pollock's full report on website).

MHDC – Seeking nominations for District Community Sports Awards – passed to Mr Thompson. WCC – Invitation to join focus group on Act Local website – noted

WCALC – details of Finance Training Day. Cllr Pound proposed and Cllr Newman seconded that Cllr Winer attend this training day at a cost of £75. Clerk to also attend.

Planning:

14/00497/HOU – Otheridge House, Demolish semi derelict flat roofed timber porch. Council supported the application. 14/00266/LBC – The Manor House, The Village. Demolition of flat roofed garage, outbuilding and modern brick stable. Council support the application.

Hollands Mill – MHDC drainage have inspected and need to speak with lengthsman. Hollybush Lane Landslip. WCC have concluded this is the responsibility of the landowner. Cllr Crump agreed to discuss with him.

Possible shared jetter. A quotation has been received which will be forwarded to WCC and County Councillors for consideration. Website – Martley Parish Council have agreed to share costs. The new domain name has been registered and design is underway.

Dog fouling on playing field. Note has been placed in Teme Triangle. It was agreed to trial some additional signage on the playing field and football area. To be placed on June agenda.

Finance: Payments as circulated on schedule were agreed and cheques signed accordingly. It was unanimously agreed to continue to support Campaign to Protect Rural England and the subscription will be renewed.

Rural Rate Relief: Application received from The Lion for additional rural rate relief. Council unanimously support Option B – the business is of benefit to the local community but Parish Council cannot support it financially.

Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group: Cllr Winer reported that there is a dedicated page on the Teme Triangle website. The Terms of Reference had been issued to all members and they would supply the list of members signing up to the Code of Conduct. She also reported that there would be a presentation at the Annual Parish Meeting on May 15th.
