There will be a farewell buffet on Sun 25th Sept at 1pm in Clifton Village Hall after John's last service in the morning. Everyone in the Benefice is welcome.

John will not be replaced in our parishes and there are ongoing discussions about ways to keep the Christian ministry alive here.

NEW COMMUNITY MESSAGING SERVICE FROM 1st SEPTEMBER

The incidence of crime in our area has gone up significantly in the past year and sadly continues. There is a particular increase in burglaries to outbuildings and sheds with farm and gardening equipment being stolen.

The Neighbourhood watch team has alerted us to a new Community Messaging Service (CMS) which begins on September 1st, to which anyone can subscribe to obtain up to date information about local incidents.

The local police have also asked that residents continue to report any suspicious activity in the area by calling 101 (non urgent) or 999 (urgent).

CLIFTON ORGANISATIONS' PLEA TO PARISH COUNCIL

A letter on behalf of six organisations and clubs in Clifton has been sent to parish councillors urging them to reconsider the Parish Council's decision to cease publication of draft minutes of their meetings in Teme Triangle.

The letter, from Clifton Women's Institute secretary, Beth Whittenbury, requested that Clifton Parish Council "will once again allow the publication of the draft and un-adopted Parish Council minutes to appear in the Teme Triangle as soon as possible after each meeting has taken place. There is little point in publishing minutes that are months out of date".

"Not everyone has access to the web site and in the wider farming community and for rural residents, also part of Clifton Parish, the connection to the internet is often poor and unreliable. Many elderly and housebound residents rely on their copy of the Teme Triangle for local news and information. Even those who can get out and about may not find it easy to stand and read a typed copy of the minutes in the Parish Council notice board."

"Between us we have not heard one positive comment to support the withdrawal of this integral part of our local news distribution. Parishioners have been puzzled as to why the decision has been made by their Parish representatives, in particular because the Shelsley draft and un-adopted minutes are still appearing with no apparent difficulty".

"With openness and freedom of information in mind, there should be no problem either with guidelines or even legislation as long as the minutes are headed appropriately that they are 'Draft' and 'Un-adopted'."

The letter was sent on behalf of the Clifton WI, St Kenelm's Parochial Church Council, the Clifton Friendship Club, the Lion Coffee Group, Clifton Bowling Club and the Trustees of Clifton Village Hall.

MY WELSH IRONMAN CHALLENGE -SUNDAY 18TH SEPTEMBER 2016 -FOR ED BARRETT

My name is Emma Carpenter, I live in Upper Sapey and I am married to Richard Carpenter (CarpenterGoodwin, Leominster) and I have 2 beautiful children Harriet (12) and Henry (11). In just over 3 weeks I am taking on the Welsh Ironman in Tenby, considered by most as one of the worlds hardest, two days short of my 47th birthday for Ed Barrett from Bromyard.



Ed's family home is The Noakes, just out of Bromyard on the Leominster road, where his mother and father, Dave and Sally and brother Russ, farm and run the well renowned Riding School. Some of you may also know Roger Benbow owner of Tipton Riding School at Tedstone Delamere. He is Ed's Uncle.

I met Ed when he was 12 years old, when teaching him in the Clifton-on-Teme Hunt Pony Club. I helped him achieve the highest accolade in PC, his 'A Test' and achieve his Teaching Qualifications. Ed always wanted to be a jockey, so I suggested he go down to Devon to my brother Ed Walkers' racing Yard which he runs with his wife 8 times Champion Amateur Jockey Polly Gundry. He had 5+ happy years down there and was very successful, before joining Henry Daley's Establishment on Clee Hill as Assistant Trainer.

Unfortunately, soon into his new job, Ed had a life changing fall whilst riding in a point to point in Devon in April 2015. He broke his neck badly. The progress he has made from being horizontal to where he is now is incredible and a credit to his own determination and hard work. However, he is 27 years old and his life will never be what he thought it would be.

We all know the risks of such sports, but most of us get away with it.

So I felt the need to do something to raise funds for Ed. Anyone who is familiar with Tenby will be aware of the strong winds, rough seas and of course the hilly terrain. I will start by swimming 2 1/2 miles from North Beach, before cycling 112 miles climbing well over 2000 m and then running a full marathon. A huge challenge 2 days short of my 47th birthday but nothing compared with the pain and challenges Ed struggles with on a daily basis.



MHDC CHAIRMAN'S HIKE FOR HEALTH





"One of the advantages of being a vicar's wife is that people confide spiritual things to me. The number of amazing little stories, each one unique, has strengthened my own faith. I too have doubts and questions but have been encouraged by others' stories.



It's the number and overall similarities between these incidents which, for me, prove that there is indeed a Spiritual Realm and an Afterlife. The number of shared experiences are too many and too various to have been made up.

One incident involved Mr Spot, my dog, pricking his ears and wagging his tail at an empty corner of the room, while my husband John prayed with a dying gentleman. When his wife opened her eyes she said she had "sensed" a "presence" precisely where Mr Spot has been staring. She had not seen the dog's behaviour so, when I told her she felt comforted that an Angel was there for her husband.

I have been told of several similar experiences. Animals obviously have more 6th sense than us, or we merely dismiss ours with our human Rationale?

The other thing I've learnt is about attitudes to our five Teme Triangle church buildings. I have taken part in events around the villages meeting a cross section of you. It seems to me that whatever individual attitudes to Church are, you'd like our churches to survive....That is really encouraging.

Many of us love History; our historic churches are worth saving. But also places gain ambience over time. In Belsen no birds sing; in churches, where prayers have been said, many find real solace.

As we prepare to leave this lovely place, I go with two encouragements. Firstly that there is a Holy Spirit to watch over you; and secondly that our five lovely churches will survive!"

TEME VALLEY WILDLIFE by Stephanie Mocroft

My knowledge of birds is limited, but whilst contemplating a subject for these lines I have been struck by a beautiful and quite relentless birdsong in my garden. Carolling and swooping in inventive melodies and trills, it has assailed my ears through the open windows of the house. On more than one occasion I have ventured out to scan the branches of the birch tree, the source of the singing, but despite looking high up and then peering into the lower greenery I have been unable to see the songster. Eventually I enlisted the help of my husband, a keen singer himself, and armed with binoculars he went outside to look into the tree. He reported that the only bird that he could see was a goldfinch.

We are lucky to see lots of goldfinches, sometimes up to a dozen at a time. When we first came to the Teme valley the most numerous birds in the garden were, by quite a way, chaffinches. Many greenfinches visited too. Over the last half a dozen years these two species have declined, an infectious disease has apparently been the cause, and the goldfinches seem to have taken over their niche. But what pretty birds the goldfinches are! Golden-brown with red and yellow highlights, no wonder a group of them is known as a charm.

At one time they were widely kept as cage birds, attractive both to look at and to listen to. In fact they were so popular that protecting them in the wild was one of the first priorities of the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds when it was formed in 1904. But why do some birds, such as the mistle thrush, sing from a prominent high point, and others sing from the camouflaged depths of greenery? Maybe the goldfinch's hidden singing spot reflects its choice of nest site. Typically it nests at the end of a horizontal or down-sweeping branch that ends in plenty of twiggy growth. The latter provides dense foliage to hide the nest from sight and the thin twigs at the end of the branch stop bigger birds standing on them to threaten the nest.

My garden is not the only place I have seen these birds lately. An exhibition to celebrate 500 years since the death of the celebrated mediaeval painter, Hieronymous Bosch, has at its heart his most famous work, The Garden of Earthly Delights. In it is to be found a most beautiful rendering of a goldfinch. It was apparently frequently used in religious works, especially in those of a devotional nature, and only doves were more likely to be depicted.

The next meeting of the Teme Valley Wildlife Group is on Thursday 8th September, when we welcome Mike Glyde who will be talking on British bats. The meeting is at Rochford Village Hall at 7:30pm and as always it is just £2 on the door where everybody is most welcome.
