BUILDING TO START IN POUND LANE, CLIFTON

Building work is due to start on the new Blue Shot Meadow development of 48 houses in Pound Lane, Clifton, in January. Contractors have already moved on to an adjacent site in preparation.



Lovell Homes, the developer, have

announced that the first houses will be ready for occupation by next summer.

As part of the planning permission agreement with Malvern Hills District Council, they will be contributing nearly £500,000 to the local community infrastructure: £32,340 towards public transport, £220,800 towards recreation facilities, £43,000 towards transport strategy and £176,365 towards education.

LION WINS AA 4 STAR AWARDS

The Lion Inn in Clifton has been given an AA 4-star Silver Award in recognition of the superior level of quality, high standard of hospitality, service and cleanliness. In addition, the Lion has been given a separate Breakfast award and a Dinner award in recognition of their very special high quality with emphasis on freshly prepared local ingredients.

Chef Steve Bruce said, "We are delighted to have received these three awards so soon after taking over the management of the Lion."





JOHN THACKER'S 90TH

John Thacker's 90th birthday celebrations last month raised a total of £650 for St Michael's Hospice. More than 90 guests attending the event contributed.

CLIFTON UPON TEME IN 1668

In 1668 King Charles II had been on the throne for eight years and England was settling down after the turbulent times following his father's execution. Worcestershire had been important both at the beginning of the Civil War and at the end, and had endured much violence and uncertainty.

The relatively stable times in which the folk of Clifton upon Teme then found themselves gave them the confidence to order bells for their parish church, St. Kenelm's. Those bells, the very same ones, are still up in the bell tower and are regularly rung out to call villagers to prayer, mark an event of national or religious importance or celebrate their weddings.

Next year marks the bells' 350th birthday. Five of the bells have hung in the belfry since 1668 – the sixth treble bell was presented in 1914 by Sir Francis Winnington. The peal was last rehung in 1999 after undergoing restoration work (right).



To maintain the link with those villagers from the time of King Charles, the bell tower needs new ringers. Bellringers do not need to be super-fit, neither do they have to be churchgoers. People of all faiths or none are invited to help maintain the tradition for generations to come. The band meets for practice on Tuesdays at 7.30pm and all are welcome. Recruits are taught a pastime which is good for one's health and the community. Come along and try bellringing!

The Central Council of Church Bell Ringers announced they are going to mark the 100th anniversary of the ending of the First World War next year by recruiting 1,400 new bell ringers - the number of bell ringers who perished in that war.

CHRISTMAS MEMORY TREE

The Churches Conservation Trust has supplied Old St. Bartholomew's Church with a Christmas Memory Tree for people to write messages for loved ones, past or present, to hang upon the tree over the Christmas period. The tree will be in place by 3rd December.



FRIENDSHIP CLUB'S CHARITY INSTEAD OF CHRISTMAS CARDS

Clifton Friendship Club members have once again chosen to donate to a charity instead of exchanging Christmas cards. This year, they will be giving to the Clifton Early Learning Centre.

"We would like to wish all members, friends and families a very happy Christmas with good health and happiness for the New Year," says Marie Thompson.

CLIFTON TREE WARDEN RESIGNS

Bert Bradley, Clifton's Tree Warden, is stepping down from the role that he has had for more than 40 years. Announcing his decision to resign at last month's meeting of the Parish Council, Bert said he hoped that someone with a strong interest in trees would take on "this important but not very arduous voluntary task".

"My interest in trees started at an early age," said Bert. "Since becoming Tree Warden for Clifton, I have met many people who are completely soaked in tree knowledge, including the caretaker of the Queen's trees in Windsor Great Park. I have also learned about coppicing and pruning of trees, hedge-laying and how to identify trees and their diseases."

Parish Tree Wardens are responsible for tree conservation, knowing where planning rules apply and observing local tree conditions.

OFSTED PLAUDIT FOR CLIFTON SCHOOL

Clifton Primary School has just had another good OFSTED inspection. Following a visit last month, the Inspector concluded that the school, last inspected in December 2012, 'continues to be a good school'.

Amongst many other positive attributes, the Inspector commented that '(*The Headteacher*), staff and Governors have created an environment in which every child feels valued'. Also that '*The children come first* and are central to the school's work... an inclusive community where innovation is welcomed and every small step to success is celebrated.' Of the pupils, the Inspector noted, '*Pupils behave well and have positive* attritudes towards learning... they work hard and support one another when working collaboratively. Their manners are impeccable, showing courtesy at all times and moving sensibly around the school.' Good quality teaching was found to be a strong aspect of provision at Clifton, and findings from the Inspection reflect that '...all teachers are very committed to ensuring every child receives the highest quality of teaching', and 'effective feedback...enables pupils to address weaknesses in their work and make strong progress'.

Headteacher, Cathryn Throup, said "I know that every member of staff and every governor is unstinting in their commitment to providing the very best quality education for the pupils who attend our school. While we will ensure that our school continues to offer high quality teaching, I hope that the additional funding received from a boost in pupil numbers from the planned housing developments within the village will help to secure the future viability of this school, which has served this community since 1844."

Malvern Hills District Councillor Caroline Palethorpe reminded the Council and residents that she still had a small amount of monies left from the ward budget scheme and encouraged applications for funding. Affordable Housing: The Council had been approached by a resident seeking local affordable housing within the parish. Information received from Housing Development Officer Emma Jordan states that there is no local authority housing within the parish. Seven bungalows and six houses are owned by Fortis Housing. There are two households on the waiting list for properties. The Stanford Bridge footbridge and any work required after the bridge works at New Mill have been completed.

Budget: The preliminary figures prepared by the Clerk to determine the level of the precept for 2018/19 were accepted. The indication is for the Precept to remain the same at $\pounds4,000$

Village Hall Management Committee: The Chairman had been contacted as there was some discussion about grass cutting. This is not a Parish Council matter and the VHMC must resolve it. A note was left in the Village Hall from Churches Together in the Teme Valley thanking both the Parish Council for allowing tables to be set for an event on the 8th November and the VHMC for its excellent facilities and cleanliness.
