SUPERFAST BROADBAND LATEST

CLIFTON

The latest estimate for Superfast Broadband availability to go 'live' in Clifton is now some time between April and June this year.

Steve Ashton, the Senior Project Manager at Worcestershire County Council responsible for working alongside BT on the programme, said they are awaiting the arrival of a new cabinet to be installed near the existing broadband cabinet outside the church in the village (the proposed site is on the opposite side of the road). Once power and fibre optic cable was connected, it could then go live – a process that was expected to take several weeks. The original estimate of superfast broadband availability between January and March was unlikely to be achieved; further delays remain possible



BT Regional Director Ian Binks said that once the cabinet goes live, local residents should contact their service provider and ask for an upgrade to a fibre service. "From the cab going live and to all service providers being aware it is live can take up to ten working days. Not all service providers have fibre services in their portfolio so be prepared to shop around; it might be time for a new supplier with a better deal anyway."

"Premises connected to the new fibre optic cabinet will get different download speeds depending upon how far away from the cabinet they are (i.e. length of telephone line, not as the crow flies). My rule of thumb is 1.5km or more and your maximum download might be getting down towards lower double figures double figures (below 20Mbps). A useful independent check can be found at https://www.btwholesale.com/ includes/adsl/adsl.htm?s_cid=ws_furls_adslchecker; just enter your phone number and if the result that comes back in the first column of the able makes no mention of something called 'VDSL' then you are probably too far away. Some service providers do not have their numbers on this system so use the postcode and address checker at http://www.superfastworcestershire.com/#where-when. Some people unfortunately may be better off remaining where they are for their broadband service."

THE SHELSLEYS

Superfast Broadband is unlikely to be available to households in the Shelsleys until later in 2018 at the earliest and currently there are no plans, with funding linked to them, to achieve this, according to Steve

Ashton. Although some properties in the Shelsley Kings area were already connected to the Great Witley fibre optic cabinet and others to the Martley Web Mesh, he told last month's meeting of the Shelsleys' Parish Council (*right*), the Shelsley Beauchamp exchange fibre optic connection to Clifton in 2017 would not include the Shelsleys.



Mr Ashton did identify a potential 'reinvestment' into broadband, currently up to £3.25m, that has also already been approved in principle by Worcestershire County Council. This would extend coverage beyond the projected 94% superfast coverage of Worcestershire by autumn 2017. The County Council is also investigating a third procurement, with additional funds they are looking to secure. Both of these options have the potential to benefit the Shelsleys.

BT's Ian Binks referred to Community Fibre Partnership schemes for which grants were available for communities in the final 5% of the UK not covered by the superfast broadband roll-out towards the cost of new fibre infrastructure if it served a local school.

"The Shelsleys is typical of most communities in the 'final 5%' which is one of sparsity of properties," he said. "Just one scheme to try to cover the whole parish will probably be hugely expensive; it would be better to try to identify one or two 'hamlets' and start off by putting those forward as an initial foray into finding a solution. The community will also need someone who is prepared to put in a lot of legwork, gathering support from the houses that may benefit from trying this approach. However, if someone shows an interest, I am more than prepared to meet and try to work out if we can do something. The whole premise of the community fibre partnership scheme is that we 'never say no'". Mark Constanduros, Secretary and Commercial Manager of the Midland Automobile Club that runs the Shelsley Walsh Hill Climb events, said the Club's inability to get connected to superfast broadband meant the venue had "a third world communication link despite being one of the oldest sporting attractions in the county. We are lagging behind all our competitors and it is having a negative effect on our business".

Shelsleys parish councillor John Stinton said that if the government wanted to rejuvenate rural areas, "it needed to bring broadband and mobile phone coverage quickly, not wait two or three years."

GREAT WITLEY FORECOURT WITH NO FUEL

The Great Witley Filling Station has been without fuel since November... and no-one knows when it is likely to have some any time soon.



Manager Richard Busby said the current owners of the forecourt premises, High Noon Garages, were reported as having gone into administration at the beginning of January. It is understood there has been a problem with two of the forecourt diesel storage tanks for several weeks, and the company was also in dispute with the fuel company that supplies it.

"I have no idea how much longer we will be without fuel," said Mr Busby. "The owners want to continue trading and are working to resolve the issues." The shop meanwhile remains open for business.

PONY POWER SHOWS A NEW/OLD WAY OF WORKING

Winter is the season of clearing, fencing and hedging and this winter one local contractor utilised an old technique on an environmentally sensitive area.

Tom Amos from Worcester Coppice Crafts brought in a local team of gypsy cobs to help clear scrub from a steep bank, a method that is enjoying a revival lately.



"Not many people do it properly," he told us, "but it is a cost effective, low impact way of clearing land, especially land that is environmentally sensitive."

The horses, seasonally named Holly and Ivy, came along with owner 'Crunchie' from Avenbury near Bromyard. They are not shod so they have more grip and don't damage the ground and are one of the few teams employed full time in clearance work. As well as logging, pony power can be used to transport a wide range of materials, both on and off road. It's a greener solution, and if it is simply too wet, too steep or just too awkward a great idea. Draft Abbreviated Minutes of The Shelsleys Parish Council Meeting held on January 10th 2017

Present: Mr C Roberts (Chairman)Mr W Sutherland, Mr T Taylor, Mrs C Warren, Mr D Bates, Mr J Stinton, Mr M Whitefoot, Mr B Hart and Mr D Styles. **In Attendance**: County Councillor Dr Pollock the Clerk (Mrs J Speyer) and 19 members of the public. **Apologies**: District Councillor Mrs Caroline Palethorpe. **Declaration of Interest**: Councillors Bates and Stinton for Village Hall item 13 **Minutes**: The minutes of November 8th 2016 were proposed and seconded and signed as a true record.

Superfast Broadband: Ste Ashton Project Manager from Worcester County Council outlined the position for providing superfast broadband to the Shelsleys. He gave a background to the roll out phases 1 and 2 in which most of the Shelsleys were not identified as an area to which superfast broadband would be provided. Shelsley Beauchamp is in the 5% of communities to which provision of superfast broadband is most difficult and expensive. BT is currently reevaluating the position and it is hoped that within "weeks or months" a decision will be made as to whether it is viable to provide the infrastructure for the Shelsleys. This parish will not be included in the proposed roll out for Clifton but as Ian Binks from BT pointed out with fibre enabled cabinets at Great Witley and Clifton, the Shelsleys are closer to superfast broadband than ever before. Public information is available on the WCC website, under "I'm not currently in the Superfast Worcestershire Roll Out Plan" www.superfastworcestershire.com in the event that either BT does not provide the service and or members of the public decide to look at alternative providers.

Public Question Time: All related to the above and were answered. **District Councillor's report and County Councillor's Report**: These are available in full on the website.

WCC reports on Highways Matters. Lengthsman's Report. The bridge at Stanford will be weeded. Councillors inspected and agreed worksheets. B 4203 Accidents - none reported. Upper Sapey crossroads to the junction of the B4203, there has been no progress on the suggestion that double white lines be installed on this section of road. The newly painted and renovated railings at New Mill bridge have been damaged, clerk to report this to WCC.

Planning: No plans outstanding. MHDC decisions. 16/01377/FUL Barn adjacent to The Birche. Refused.

Clerk's report on urgent decisions. None

Finance: The following requests for payment were agreed: Clerk's salary and expenses. Lengthman's invoice. HMRC and Worcestershire CALC

The above totalled £1098.00. Monies received from WCC in respect of repayment for Lengthsman £520.00

STANFORD CHURCH ROOF LEAD THEFT

"And in dropping the lead from the roof, they have damaged a gravestone. It's ironic that one set of visitors to the grave left a wreath in loving memory, and these miscreants left the grave with a broken cross. If anyone saw a vehicle with a ladder around the time of the theft, please let us know. The stupidity of it is that the cost of making good the damage will be far more than the value of the lead."

Land for Sale (Lot 1) Pound Lane: Members resolved (HW/NP) that approval of final draft and printing arrangements for the consultation letter be delegated to the Clerk in consultation with MN/WB.

Neighbourhood Development Plan Steering Group: Members unanimously resolved (MN/RH) that the tabled NDP documents be submitted to MHDC.

Pavilion and Playing Field: Update re maintenance and repair of the bike trail – RW progressing. Update re signage - car parking and ball games - BY progressing. Update re matters relating to hedges and trees; RW to contact householder and quote for maintenance of hedge between Forge Meadow and BP hut. Members noted report from MN re damage to Bp hut. MN to investigate provision of half-barrel tubs for gap in playing field boundary with Pound Lane.

Village Pound: Members resolved (MN/WB) that the pound marker stone be located at the juncture of the playing field car park fence and Pound Lane. Members further resolved (MN/WB) that the plaque on the pound marker stone be inscribed as follows:

"This stone marks the site of the Village Pound. The Pound was important. The purpose

of it was to impound stray animals which were often to be found wandering the lanes and roads and grazing the road verges. They were shut in a fenced area and the owners had to pay to retrieve them. Villagers erected paling fences to protect their gardens, especially their vegetables, on which they were dependent. Old village photographs show this fencing. Donated by Councillor Parkinson in 2016."

Nora Parsons Day Centre: MN reported that the centre was looking to parish councils to contribute towards costs of providing for residents to use the service. Further consideration deferred until budget consultation in January 2017.
