WELCOME to the June edition of Teme Triangle.

With another election this month, I was relieved to find that our inbox includes stories about ancient traditions, our communities and developments in farming rather than politics! We have all your news and events and we have an update on that controversial Velo bike ride planned for September.

Richard told us: "I was thrilled to meet both Steve and Ben. Steve was obviously a hero of mine and Ben did something truly remarkable last year when he ran 401 marathons, and raised a fantastic amount of money for charity".

VELO BIKE RIDE UPDATE

As we reported last month, there is great concern across the Teme Valley about the plan for a 15,000 strong Birmingham bike ride through our villages on 24th September, particularly as it promises entrants (who have each paid £75),



'closed roads' for 6 hours on the day. This would cause huge inconvenience and financial losses for businesses and individuals along the route.

Our, Worcestershire County Councillor Ken Pollock reports.

"On 8th May, Worcestershire County Council and Herefordshire Council officers met CSM, the organisers of the Velo bike ride, and spelt out the problems they see in running this race. They gave the organisers until the middle of June to come up with a comprehensive plan for mitigating the disruption and losses likely to be experienced by residents and businesses along the route.

Apparently, the organisers talked about the possibility of placing cones along the centre line of the route, so that the cyclists would have unimpeded access to the left lane and vehicles could use the right lane. Such a plan is fraught with difficulty, not least that the vehicles would only be allowed to go in one direction, presumably that of the race. Secondly, it is not clear what they would do at junctions, or if they wanted access to premises on the left of the road. I think we can discount this suggestion.

In consequence, one has to contemplate the possibility of the race being cancelled in mid-June. At that point, the organisers might conceivably suggest running the event but on open roads. Much less fun for all concerned, and a bit limiting on speed, but we are used to mass bike rides. It would not be impossible to imagine this taking place, although would expect organisers would give the entrants the chance of withdrawing and perhaps arranging to return their booking fees.



If the relevant politicians are not satisfied with the mitigation arrangements, then they will need to withhold permission for the closed roads and the whole matter is settled immediately. As someone who might be involved in that decision, I have no hesitation in saying that I would be prepared to withdraw support.

In the meantime, anyone wishing to let the organisers know of their concerns should email them at route@velobirmingham.com in the hope that they will receive help. To be fair, the Velo document merely says they would "provide you with more information on how you can best navigate your way around the road closures". In other words, total strangers are going to tell you how to move around the roads you know like the back of your hand.

I would call that astonishing cheek and extreme complacency! "

A spokesman for the Velo event told Teme Triangle: "We will be asking the public to remove vehicles from the route to facilitate the ride wherever possible. If vehicles are blocking the route in any way that endangers the cyclists or narrows the route so much that it causes a hazard, we will be working with a number of private lifting companies to move vehicles to a location as close as possible to its original location, which removes this risk to the participants."

Watch this space!

ANNUAL SERVICE AND PICNIC AT OLD ST. BARTHOLOMEW'S

Once again this year, the tiny church of Old St. Bartholomew in Lower Sapey will open its doors for a service of thanksgiving and afternoon picnic in the gardens. The site has been used for worship since 1086 and it was mentioned in documents relating to a grant made by Offa King of the Mercians in 781.

With the building of a new church across the fields in Harpley by the Evans family of Whitbourne Hall in 1876, the liturgical life of this exquisite little church ended, and it was to have been knocked down, but this instruction was never carried out and the church became an applestore, henhouse and repository for old junk.

Now it is a scheduled ancient monument and in the care of of the The Churches Conservation Trust, being a very rare example of a an almost unchanged Norman church with wall paintings from the Middle Ages.

So if you have never visited, note the date, it is a very special place known locally as 'paradise'.

Old St. Bartholomew's Annual Church Service is on Sunday 27th August at 3pm. Please bring a picnic and a chair. The guest speaker will be announced in TT's July/August edition.



SHELSLEYS ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The Chairman of the Parish Council's Report

Matters covered were:

In addition the Precept was reviewed and reduced to £4,000 for the year. Grants to local causes are made when applications are made and these are constantly reviewed.

The Chairman thanked the Councillors who have served this year, the Parish Lengthsman, Parish Paths Officer and Clerk.

DOG FOULING CRACKDOWN LAUNCHED

New offences are being introduced by Malvern Hill District Council to help tackle dog fouling and other dog control offences in the area, the first Worcestershire authority to introduce a Public Space Protection Order for Dog Control, which creates three new offences.

They are:

Failing to carry a dog poop bag or other means to clean up after a dog Failure to keep a dog on a lead in a designated area Failure to keep a dog out of fenced off or enclosed children's playgrounds

The new powers, introduced under the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014, will come into force in June. Anyone committing one of the new offences will be given a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) of up to £100 and £1,000 court fine if they fail to pay.

CLIFTON ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Neighbourhood Plan

Clifton's Neighbourhood Plan is still with Malvern Hills District Council, awaiting the appointment of an External Examiner who will then take four to six weeks to complete his or her report, according to Helen Winer, Chair of the Clifton Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group.

"Following this, the plan may need some minor modification before proceeding to the parish referendum later this year," she said. "Production of the Neighbourhood Plan has been fully funded by the government Locality Grant scheme. I would encourage all parishioners to support the plan when it comes to referendum. It has been a long haul and it is exciting to be nearly finished."

Clifton WI

Clifton WI members have again asked the Parish Council to resume publication of the up-to-date draft minutes of their meetings in Teme Triangle. Presenting her report, WI President Martine Jones said written requests for prompt publication of the minutes were neither acknowledged or minuted even though attention was drawn to the guidelines that state draft minutes should be published no more than a month after the meeting.

Superfast Broadband

Superfast Broadband should be available to most Clifton residents "any time after June" according to County Councillor Ken Pollock in his report to the Annual Parish Meeting. This will provide a faster broadband speed to "about 220 premises, leaving around 100 without". He added that subscribers will have to register their interest and sign up for the faster service in order to receive it. "You need to opt in to benefit".

Tenbury Bus Service

The new Tesco development in Tenbury has resulted in £95,000 being made available to the Tenbury Transport Trust which, says Councillor Ken Pollock, "should guarantee the provision of the Tuesday bus service to and from Tenbury for Clifton residents for at least the next five years," before adding: "the service cannot continue if levels of use are too low".

Velo Birmingham Bike Race

The Velo Birmingham bike race planned for Sunday, 24the September, routed through Clifton and other main roads in the Teme valley area, could be cancelled unless the organisers come up with "a comprehensive system of mitigation arrangements for all those affected by road closures" according to Cllr Pollock. "They have until mid-June to demonstrate this has been accomplished or the race will be cancelled," despite an entry of 15,000 cyclists each paying at least £75 entry fee.



GOOD NEWS!

A family farm business with a thirst for new markets...

Local publicans had a good day out recently as guests of farmer Geoff Thompson and his family in Frith Common. The group spent the day finding out more about the production of Oldfields Orchard cider, their latest product. Hop growing is traditional in the Teme Valley. Once pickers crowded onto trains from the Black Country each September, but since the war there has been a steady decline.

Geoff Thompson has farmed his 400 acres at Lambswick and Oldfieldssince 1978 growing cereals and livestock as well as hops, and he teamed up with Nick Davis from Cleobury Mortimer 20 years ago supplying specialist hops for the, now award winning, Hobsons micro brewery. Despite the success of their 'real ale' the micro brewery only took a small percentage of Geoff's crop so he started replanting apple orchards and seven years ago teamed up with Hobsons again to produce a 'real' cider.

"The US is planting hopyards madly so there will be an oversupply soon but craft cider is growing in popularity. We have around 14,000 trees here and have built an entire bottling operation on the farm so it is a truly local product. Our cider has a slow fermentation...you can taste the difference, it's all in the aroma."

It is a real family affair because Geoff's two sons Josh and Digby have now rejoined the farm business with their families, and as the new bottling plant was installed this week, with a contribution from a Defra grant, they are all gearing up for the autumn harvest.


