ADOPTION STORY SEQUEL

In the March *Teme Triangle* I wrote an article ahead of my trip to Hong Kong. It appears to have generated interest amongst readers and more than one person has urged me to write a follow up piece.

You may recall that I was planning to visit the orphanage - Po Leung Kuk (PLK) where I spent the first two years of my life before being adopted by an English couple in the 1960s. I made that visit, along with friends Stuart and Jill Smith, also Teme Valley residents, who had themselves adopted a child from PLK some 20 years later. We spent the morning with a lovely social worker, Stella. She seemed so interested in us and I think we were quite a tonic for her as we were sharing 'good news' stories; adoption placements of course do not always work out.



She showed us around the area where babies and children are now cared for and we had chance to go in the original building where I would have been looked after which is now a museum. She also arranged for three photos to be developed and gave me these plus a progress report of me at five months and some weight charts. One photo of me as a tiny baby is very special to me as I had not seen these before; it was also interesting to read about me as a five month old! In addition Stella provided us with the addresses of the Adoption Unit in Hong Kong's Social Services as well as the location of International Social Services and suggested we went there if I wanted to find out more about my background. This we did and again encountered equally helpful and interested staff – each were willing to help me trace my roots.

Since returning from Hong Kong I have been sent more information about my very humble beginnings. It would be a bit difficult to write the detail in this article but for those who I have read it to, it has not surprisingly generated strong emotions, mostly in recognition of how vulnerable my birth mother was, it is not easy reading.

People have asked me how I feel about all this. For those who know me, you will know I have a strong personal Christian faith. The journey I am now on with my root tracing has unexpectedly become a spiritual one too. It has generated many questions for me but also re-enforced the strong sense I have of God's protection and love for me, which I believe He has for each of us, whatever our backgrounds. I returned from Hong Kong with an inner joy and peace and sense of security in God which may seem counter intuitive. But this is giving me the resolve to find out more about what happened to my birth mother and reach out to her - if of course she is still alive. I have been given leads as to where I should go next but I realise it may not be an easy journey either practically or emotionally. It also motivates me to continue to support others who are vulnerable. I have been so blessed in my life despite not the best introduction into the world. I am extremely grateful to many people who have helped me tap into my potential and most of all am grateful to God for holding me in his hands and not letting go of me.

Maybe I will have to do another update when I have more to share on this fascinating journey I am on...

Church Matters

The Dead Sea region lying 1,412 feet below sea level is one of the World's driest areas. In Old Testament times it is thought to have been less arid, archaeological excavations have found ashen remains of prosperous cities such as Sodom and Gomorrah. Reliable water supplies would have attracted nomadic people to settle.



North is Ein Gedi, commanding spectacular views over the Dead Sea to modern day Jordan. The springs and streams have flowed continuously, providing life-giving water for animals and myriad plants long before David was being pursued by Saul up the precipitously steep and rocky stream bed, (1 Samuel Ch 24). Today there is a modern 'oasis', Kibbutz Ein Gedi, founded in 1956, with a magnificent botanical garden, offering a welcome to travellers to this peaceful place, still reliant on the natural water supply.

In 2 Chronicles Ch 20 there are accounts of date palm groves and in Joshua Ch 15, v 62 it is prophesied that this location will be a fishing village, "after the... waters have been made sweet".

Travelling on towards Jericho, the oldest, continuously occupied town on Earth, in this seemingly barren landscape, the urge to find a picnic lunch spot creeps up. In the distance, above date palms, a golden dome comes into view, another 'oasis', the Monastery of St Gerassimos. Enormous snap-dragons, marigolds and rose bushes, vegetables, hens and goats mix together; wild birds sing happily refreshed by water from the River Jordan similar to our own River Teme. There is a sense of tranquillity and timelessness. A cheery Palestinian runs a cafe providing freshly squeezed orange juice & dates. This 'oasis' is one of the earliest Monasteries founded in AD 456 by Gerassimos, a monk from Lycia, Turkey. He and his monks lived a prayerful life, living on dates and bread,

Tradition says Gerassimos found a lion near the River Jordan, roaring in pain from a thorn in his paw. He removed it; the lion befriended him and lived at the monastery. One day merchants stole the monks' donkey, sometime later the same thieves passed by; the lion recognised the donkey and rescued it.

From time to time we all need an 'oasis' for personal refreshment. Maybe just time in the garden, a dog-walk or a kindly listening ear, for others, the peace found in the tranquillity of a 21st century monastery. As God said, the seventh day is to rest our minds and bodies and to refuel ourselves.






