## LOCAL RESIDENT PUTS SHELSLEY ON THE FASHION MAP

Former Teme Valley resident Ella Griffee has embarked on a new creative venture designing and making her own clothing line in Cornwall.

Ella, 26, whose parents Andy and Helen Griffee still live in Shelsley Kings, studied fashion design at Falmouth University and honed her skills working for Cornish clothing company Seasalt.

Ella explained the concept behind her new business. "Having borrowed more than my fair share of my father's shirts, an idea started to form. The comfort and familiarity of these oversized shirts couldn't be paralleled. I adore the ritual of rolling my sleeves up and the security of a much-loved item. Gorgeously worn in and sturdy, these shirts became a reliable friend."

She added, "This collection is an exploration of family and familiarity. The garments are designed to be worn by me and you, and then taken

worn by me and you, and then taken by the next generation searching for their piece of home to carry with them."

"My garments are made from natural materials, and cut and sewn by me from start to finish in my Cornish studio. The buttons are Cornish through and through - made from recycled nylon sourced from fishing nets hauled in off the coast and 3D printed into beautiful, strong buttons."

Ella's clothing line includes shirts and rugby shirts for men and women, including one design named after her home village – the Shelsley Button Down Shirt.



**Present:** Dr Laura Taylor (Chairman) Mrs Val Jones and Mrs Jean Hammond. This represented a quorum. **In Attendance:** 3 members of the public and the clerk.

**Apologies:** Councillors Bates, Stinton, Styles, Metcalfe and Hutton & District Councillor Palethorpe. County Councillor Dr Pollock sent apologies after the meeting. There were **No Declarations of Interest**:

**Minutes:** The minutes of July 9<sup>th</sup> & August 3rd 2020 were agreed as a true record.

**Public Question Time**: None. **Election of Vice Chairman:** To be confirmed at the next meeting.

Shelsley Beauchamp Vacancy: This will be re-advertised. County Councillor and District Councillor's reports: The full reports are available on the website details below. Highways Footpaths and Lengthsman: The Lengthsman's worksheets for July and August were agreed.

All highways matters brought to the attention of the clerk, mainly overgrown verges and hedges, have been resolved.

Salt, the Lengthsman has 1 ton stored, it was agreed a further ton will be ordered by October 1st.

The broken chevron sign by Stirt lay bye has been reported to WCC.

**Planning:** There were no outstanding planning applications to be discussed. 19/00610/ FUL Appeal result at Fetterlocks Farmhouse (agricultural building to dwelling). The appeal was dismissed.

VAT repayment received. £1137.22 The Internal Auditor was thanked for completing the relevant section of the 2019/2020 Annual Return.

**Village Hall.** Covid-19 restrictions and advice form NALC (National Association of Local Councils) has meant the last four meetings have been held virtually by Zoom. It was agreed as a gesture of goodwill to make a donation of £40 to cover the loss of rent to the Village Hall Management Committee.

It was reported by the management that the Village Hall is fully Covid-19 compliant and is observing all the necessary requirements as is the Social Club.

**MAC:** Mr Simon Durling representing the Midland Automobile Club (MAC) reported on the coming final events for this year at the Hill Climb., 19<sup>th</sup>/20<sup>th</sup> September and a Members only meeting 25<sup>th</sup> September. Spectators have been allowed in accordance with Motorsport UK when regulations have been fulfilled. The meeting last weekend had been excellent.

**Progress Reports: Broadband: Broadband:** There has been a recent announcement on increased funding for rural superfast broadband. The Clerk is awaiting an updated report from Openreach on progress on the three current projects in the parish.

Waste Bin: The site at Stirt Farm lay by has been agreed and the delivered bin will shortly be installed by Councillor Stinton.

Repair Café: All proposed venues are on hold due to Covid-19 restrictions.

**Welcome:** The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting. Clifton Hill Helpers were thanked by the meeting for all their support locally during the ongoing CV-19 pandemic. A new resident was welcomed to the meeting.

Democratic Public Time: No matters for consideration.

Speaker: Dan Bayliss, MHDC Community & Environmental Protection Officer, Community Services. The Council heard about MHDC schemes to deter dog fouling and to encourage owners to pick up after their dogs. The Meadows development area has improved recently since signage was put up by MHDC and it is hoped that this continues. The Green Dog Walkers Scheme promotes responsible dog ownership and Cllr Collins agreed to follow this up locally. A poo bag dispenser will also be placed by the entrance to the playing field on a temporary basis by MHDC. The Council agreed to review matters periodically.

To agree the Minutes of a virtual meeting held 2<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2020 – Both sets of minutes were agreed as a true record. Proposed Cllr J. Collins, seconded Cllr C. Haywood. All agreed. The Council noted, as matters arising, that several schemes had now been implemented by Highways locally, including yellow lines and white gates. A new battery has been ordered by the Clerk for the VAS - to be installed by the Lengthsman.

District & County Councillor Reports: Reports to be uploaded to the website.

**Financial & Governance Matters:** Payments agreed as per the schedule – Michelle Alexander - Clerk salary £456.47 / Michelle Alexander - Clerks expenses - £49.05 / Came & Co - insurance renewal £920.49 / MHDC - wheelie bins £73.68 / SSE - electric to pavilion £61.99 / M.B. Higgins – website maintenance/hosting £174.39 / A. Henry – reimbursement for plants & compost £184.54

New topsy style bin for Manor Road £212.00 – Proposed Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr A. Henry. All agreed. Clerk to progress.

Clifton Upon Teme Archives Storage – J. Johns explained the option to store the village archives at the old schoolhouse. The historical material is currently stored at home but should be more readily available for the community to use. The cost to store at the old schoolhouse would be £500.00 p.a. and would be in liaison with the new Head Teacher and Governors. Some capital expenditure will be required to make the store ready for use, but this will be a long-term project and commitment for asset management. Funding via Awards for All scheme to be investigated, as school funds won't be able to meet these costs. The Council agreed that they would support the initiative, with a review in due course, and J. Johns agreed to prepare a summary brief.

**Councillor Resignation and Co-option** – The resignation of Councillor J. Dawson was accepted. The Clerk will progress the vacancy via MHDC.

Teme Valley Triangle (TVT) funding request – A request for funding had been received by the Clerk from J. Johns, which was read out to those present. The Council noted that a contribution had previously been paid by the PC and that other PCs in the area also contributed to the annual running costs. It was also noted that most of the distribution was in the Clifton upon Teme area and that the TVT is keen to keep a printed version available. It was proposed by Cllr R. Henry, seconded Cllr Bowden that the Council contribute £500.00 p.a.to the TVT. All agreed. J. Johns will forward an invoice to the Clerk in due course.

**41.20 Parish Matters: Footpaths Noticeboards** – Cllr Bowden will circulate quotes to the C for consideration at the next meeting. Recreation Ground – Cllr Bowden had visited the area and confirmed that the potholes had now been filled in. A meeting is to be arranged with Cllrs C. Haywood, Bowden & R. Henry to undertake a risk assessment of the outside space. Cllr Bowden will also contact A. Berrow (Scouts) for the meeting. It was noted that the CFAF project includes car park refurbishment. **Repairs to the Recreation Field fence** – it was agreed that R. Wilks should undertake necessary works as agreed by Cllr Bowden and the Clerk, to make the area safe.

**Kenelm Close hedge** – the hedge at the end of the close has grown far too tall and wide. Work has already been done on the Manor Road side and it was agreed that R. Wilks should do works as required to keep the hedge well maintained as it is adjacent to the footpath. The Clerk was asked to look into the ownership. Pavilion usage – the Football Club have restarted and are using the pavilion again. Cllr C. Haywood will request a Covid-19 risk assessment asap for the Clerk to approve usage. **After-school Club** – the school have already asked if the club can use the pavilion whilst work is carried out at school, when the term starts shortly. They have confirmed risk assessments and the cleaning, which will be done after use. Use of the pavilion was approved and Cllr Haywood will ask the Football Team to liaise urgently via the Clerk and Cllr Collins re usage going forward, especially with Covid-19 measures required.

Section 106 Committee update: CFAF project - C. Hurley's report had been circulated by email. Cllr R. Henry queried the size of the MUGA football area, which was explained by C. Hurley. The recommendation to use Kompan & Grimshaws was outlined to the Council, and a letter of intent was requested, which would enable the project to continue to move forward and assist in maintaining some of the current pricing. There are already indicative annual maintenance costs and C. Hurley will work with the Clerk to prepare a summary document asap in time for precept planning. R. Wilks has already been approached and has agreed to undertake the required grounds maintenance works. There was further discussion regarding community consultation and how this can be managed in the current climate. C. Hurley reminded the Council of what had been achieved so far and what was planned for the future. Cllr Bowden informed the Council of comments received by him personally. The Council agreed that the Clerk should draft a letter of intent in liaison with C. Hurley, and with a caveat re maintenance costs and the need for final approval by the Council.

**Community Transport Survey** – a draft had already been circulated by the Clerk. It was agreed to print x400 copies for distribution end Sept/Oct. Clerk to forward a quote for approval.

**Planning Matters** – Applications to be considered – 20/01046/HP Mr A. Tulloch, Hollands Mill, Clifton WR6 6HJ – rear two storey extension and refurbishment of dwelling. No objection. Proposed Cllr A. Henry, seconded Cllr R. Henry. All agreed.

Applications responded to – 20/00782/ADV Mr J. Guest land at Os 7113 6138, Hope Lane Clifton – construction site advertising. OBJECTION submitted 11/08/2020 – no permission currently in place so inappropriate to advertise.

Notifications Received – 20/00815/AGR – Cliftonswood Farm, B4204 The Village to Herefordshire – prior approval not required for an agricultural track.

**Highways Matters:** The Clerk will liaise with the Lengthsman about outstanding tasks. The replacement gully outside The Meadows is an on-going issue via Highways / County Cllr Pollock. The hedge to the rear of the BP Hut needs clarification re ownership, which the Clerk will look into. The Clerk was asked to check with WCC re notification about footpaths as they are not being regularly received.

**Correspondence:** A letter from the BP Hut Committee re car park & signage was noted. (see also Parish Matters)

**Councillors Reports & Items for Future Agendas:** The Council noted that the old storage container on the pavilion car park was currently being retained for the CFAF project, but the contractors have said it is no longer required, so other options are being explored by C. Hurley regarding disposal.

Next meeting to be held Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> October 2020 – arrangements to be confirmed. Meeting closed 21:35.





#### TEME VALLEY WILDLIFE

Following the many footpaths that criss-cross our island is an excellent way of keeping fit, seeing the countryside and enjoying the great outdoors. In 2006 my husband and I set out to walk the length of the River Teme in the company of two friends who were fellow residents of the valley. Fourteen years and thirteen long-distance paths later, we arrived at the Worcestershire Beacon on a sunny day in July to celebrate 1000 miles of walking together. Looking back over our rambles, many of them in the beautiful Welsh Marches, I wondered how much wildlife we had seen and what had been our most memorable encounters. Admittedly, four people chattering along a narrow path is not the ideal way to find God's creatures, but we did have some interesting moments.

Deer were the largest animals we met. On the Mortimer Trail we were lucky to spy a good-sized herd of the unusual long-haired fallow deer that inhabit the Mortimer Forest. They are unique to that place and are thought to have been there since Norman times. Occasionally we had a glimpse of the larger red deer, but these were invariably sprinting away as we emerged from woodland into quiet valleys. Badgers, foxes, stoats, rabbits and rodents all kept their distance, but we enjoyed looking at their tracks, especially when newly printed in snow. The best sightings were of hares, starting up from the long grass and jinking off out of danger with long ears bobbing. Wonderful.

Birds were easier to spot. Many of our walks were accompanied by skylarks and we were frequently soared over by red kites. High up the Carding Mill valley we reversed the situation by looking down on a kite hunting below, whilst at the same time a cuckoo called in the distance. Sometimes we saw birds we didn't recognise. On the Teme at Martley a flock of smart waterbirds proved to be a group of female goosanders and on brassica fields near Bredon we came upon a pair of yellow wagtails. By water we caught the odd flash of kingfisher blue and saw lots of herons, both real and plastic. Once we came upon a dark pond lined with half-dead trees. In the branches were perched dozens of hunched-up herons, looking very disconsolate on a wet, Welsh, winter day.

More lively were insects. My interest in dragonflies meant that sometimes I was able to contribute a few records for the farer-flung parts of Worcestershire. Out with the field-guide though, for some busy yellow moths fluttering along a sunny woodland edge. These were brimstone moths and just as beautiful as their namesake butterflies.

We saw lots of flowers. I had my first sightings of early purple orchids on The Worcestershire Way, moschatel on the Offa's Dyke Path and autumn crocus on The Herefordshire Trail. Over the years we covered many types of terrain from lowland arable and meadowland to upland pasture, moor and marshland. We enjoyed countless stunning views of the countryside, deepening our love for the wonderful area we live in. We only hope that the next 1000 miles will be as fine as the first.

The next meeting of the Teme Valley Wildlife Group is on hold whilst we await the re-opening of our venue. Our meetings are usually held at Stoke Bliss and Kyre village hall, WR15 8RR, at 7:30pm. It is just £2 on the door and everybody is most welcome.


