## CLIFTON FOUR ACRE FIELD PROJECT GETS GO-AHEAD

Clifton Parish Council formally adopted the Four Acre Field project in November and agreed that the S106 application can now be written by the Project Team, to be signed off by the Parish Council in January and submitted to Malvern Hills District Council for the release of £230,000 of the S106 money held by MHDC so that work can begin next year.

## **Update:**

The overall plan for the Four Acre Field was signed off by the CFAF Project Team in October and delivered to the Parish Council well in advance of their November meeting to have time to consider the plan's recommendations and provide approval for the proposed scheme. The Parish Council approved the scheme and agreed that the S106 Application will be written with the intention of submitting to MHDC early January 2021.

Our District Councillor, Caroline Palethorpe, is fully aware of the plan and has offered to provide guidance and support as the application is progressed. A period of three months is allocated to the MHDC approval process and during that time, the Parish Council and members of the CFAF team will be liaising with the proposed contractors to consider the project management process and timescales required to carry out the work. It is currently thought that the original timetable of work commencing April/May 2021 and completed in readiness for the school summer holidays remains in place.

As part of the overall project, S106 funds from within the CFAF Project will also be used to asphalt the remaining part of the car park which will eventually provide, fully marked, total spaces of up to 30 vehicles including disabled bays.

Needless to say, there are a number of hurdles to go through in the coming months not least of which assessing the possible impact of Covid-19 regulations. The community will be kept fully informed of progress throughout this period via Teme Triangle, Nextdoor.co.uk, the village Facebook site and noticeboard.

The Community and Sensory Garden Project Team also provided the Parish Council with an update as well as confirming that the overall project is now likely to be funded via a mix of S106 and Natural Network Funds (via Worcestershire Wildlife Trust). The garden team are currently developing a detailed budget which will enable integration with the new field perimeter path to ensure accessibility for all.

## SHELSLEY SINGER PENS ANNIVERSARY CHORAL BOOK

A Shelsley Beauchamp resident and choral singer has written a book charting the impressive, 160-year history of leading County choir, Worcester Festival Choral Society. Michelle Whitefoot, a soprano member of WFCS who also sings in the Three Choirs Festival Chorus, wanted to record the choir's history for posterity and to raise essential funds towards its future concerts; which in normal times are staged at Worcester Cathedral and last year included greats such as Handel's Messiah and Mozart's Requiem.

The 248-page, full colour book, *A Choral Chronicle: The History of Worcester Festival Choral Society,* continues a tradition of local involvement in the 150-strong choir. Former Clifton resident and alto member Mary Parsons



wrote an earlier book about WFCS in 1996; and Clifton resident Keith Jaffery, a former Chairman of the Society, is a tenor member.

A Choral Chronicle charts the WFCS story from its Victorian origins through two constitutions, two World Wars, 11 conductors and hundreds of concerts to the present day. As well as musical achievements the book includes new archive research, conductor interviews, member memories and more than 200 eye-catching photos.

"So many people have sung in Worcester Festival Choral Society, or enjoyed its concerts, that its history is of interest to a surprising number of people!" says Michelle. "There have also been many famous-name musical connections. Sir Edward Elgar was closely involved, playing in the WFCS 'Band' and leading the Society in premieres of two of his choral works. Sir David Willcocks was the Society's conductor in the 1950s. Guest conductors have included Sir Adrian Boult, Sir Hubert Parry and Samuel Coleridge-Taylor. Sir Stephen Cleobury was a former singing member. The Chorus has sung at the Royal Albert Hall and made numerous recordings." Several of the Society's modern conductors also provided an exclusive insight into concert planning and the future of choral music.

## Draft Minutes of a Virtual Meeting of Clifton Parish Council held Thursday 5th November 2020

**Present**: Councillors J. Bowden (Chairman), A. Henry (Vice-Chairman), R. Henry, C. Haywood, J. Collins and B. Gilbert. Also present: District Councillor C. Palethorpe, M. Alexander (Clerk), J. Johns and C. Hurley and one member of the Public. Apologies: County Councillor K. Pollock.

**Welcome:** The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked the Clifton Hill Helpers for their continued support to the community.

**Co-option of a Parish Councillor**: It was proposed by Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr M. Henry, that B. Gilbert be co-opted as a Parish Councillor following an application which had been received by the Clerk and circulated prior to the meeting. All agreed. Clerk to arrange the counter-signatory of the Declaration of Office and submission of the Register of Interests as required. Cllr B. Gilbert joined the meeting.

The Minutes of a virtual meeting held 1st October 2020 were agreed as a true record. Proposed Cllr R. Henry, seconded Cllr M. Henry. No matters arising.

**District & County Councillor Reports**: Reports to be uploaded to the website. District Cllr Palethorpe raised the following matters – Covid-19 District Council update and funding available, Superfast Broadband information, Social Prescribing – Citizens Advice South Worcs, Remembrance Day information, Youth 'Make your Mark' consultation via schools from 1st - 30th Nov, Volunteering – Great Neighbourhood Scheme in the Teme Valley area

**Financial & Governance Matters**: Payments agreed as per the schedule – M. Alexander Clerk salary £469.16 / M. Alexander Clerks expenses £82.35 / M. Alexander signage £19.99 / M. Alexander notice board repairs £35.99 / M. Alexander WaterPlus payment £200.01 / M. Alexander pc security £19.99 / SSE pavilion electricity £81.79 / R. Wilks Lengthsman Sept £115.20 / R. Wilks Lengthsman Oct £158.40 / Glasdon UK Ltd litter bins x3 £635.47 / R. Wilks fencing repairs £100.80 / Teme Triangle funding contribution £500.00. Receipts – Western Power Distribution wayleaves £73.27

Appointment of Planning Lead – it was agreed by all that Cllr B. Gilbert be the Planning Lead with immediate effect. Playing Field Fees 2020 – the PC had received an application from the Bowls Club asking to waive the fees of £350.00 for 2020 due to the lack of play possible, although the bowling green had been maintained by Club members. It was proposed by Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr Gilbert that fees be waived for 2020. All agreed. Clerk to notify the Club. It was further agreed that the Chairman should contact the Football Club to see whether they also needed assistance.

**Parish Matters:** Footpaths Notice Board – x3 quotes had been obtained by the Chairman for a new notice board however as the quotes did not match the exact requirements, it was agreed that revised quotes should be sought for consideration – Cllr Bowden to progress this.

**Section 106 Committee update**: Report as circulated by C. Hurley. The Clerk had circulated the CFAF project report prior to the meeting together with a

request from C. Hurley that the PC approve the Project Plan as submitted and agree to progress with the S.106 application process via MHDC. C. Hurley also explained management and maintenance plan projected costs and how they had been calculated, including information obtained from R. Wilks re grass cutting. It was noted that the Sensory Garden is a separate project and is designed for low maintenance, and that the grass cutting costs reflect work on the main field and not the garden. MHDC will take approx, three months to process the s.106 application and subject to approval, contractors can start within six weeks of application. Further to discussion it was proposed by Cllr Gilbert to approve the CFAF Plan and to progress the s.106 application to MHDC. Seconded Cllr Collins. Vote 5:1 - carried. C. Hurley will bring the s.106 application to the next meeting for approval. Clerk & C. Hurley to progress the application with MHDC. Playing Field emergency access/hedge cutting - it was proposed by Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr M. Henry that the hedge alongside the emergency access to the playing field should be cut back as quoted (R. Wilks £200.00) to enable sufficient width for emergency vehicle access to the field. All agreed. Community Sensory Wildlife Garden – the report from H. Hurley (as circulated) was noted. C. Hurley gave an update based on the report to brief the PC on work undertaken to date.

**Section 106 Community Transport Proposal:** The survey had received 31 responses which the Clerk will collate and circulate. Cllrs M & R Henry were thanked for distribution of the surveys.

**Planning Matters** – 20/01450/HP – 26 Saxon Close, Clifton WR6 6DL – erection of rear extension and porch. No objections. 20/01449/HP – Cedar Cottage, Pound Land, Clifton WR6 6DE – Velux loft conversion, installation of new roof windows to roof space. No objections. Hope Lane development – Clerk and DCIIr Palethorpe to check current status of application asap.

**Highways Matters**: Lengthsman requested to cut back the Laurels alongside the walkway at the end of Kenelm Close through to the post box in Manor Rd. Good news that Manor Rd has been resurfaced recently. One VAS monitor has been 'resurrected' and is in place in the village. Clerk to check with R. Wilks about another two that may be available as well.

**Correspondence**: A thank you was received from the School for their use of the Pavilion during school building works recently. It was noted that the Pavilion doors don't fully seal and this could be improved to avoid winter heat loss.

**Councillors Reports & Items for Future Agendas:** Cllr Bowden has been looking into the Neighbourhood Plan with a view to reviewing it in 2021. The PC may need to reconvene the original working group / organise some refresher training in due course. There is a Councillor in Martley PC who may be willing to help, and some newer residents may also wish to be involved.

The Clerk confirmed that Play Areas will remain open during this lock down, but any adult gym equipment must not be used. Permanent social distancing signage will be put up on the playing field shortly.

## ECO CHURCH AT ST BARTHOLOME'S, HARPLEY

Bird nesting boxes have been generously donated to us by Severn Waste Services who are very helpful to the local communities around their waste areas. This has been arranged by Rev. Jen Denniston for all churches in WWRT (Worcester West Rural Team) wanting to improve wildlife facilities.

Members of our churchyard team had great fun unpacking them. Obviously they couldn't wait until Christmas Day! Parishioners used a triple extension ladder mounted them in suitable locations around the churchyard. This rather large nesting box will hopefully attract an owl family.



The grounds maintenance team have done much clearing around the churchyard and sorted the compost area removing non- degradable items such as plastic pots and especially floral foam (Oasis). The green waste heap and log piles are now providing homes for a varied selection of wildlife. There isn't the space to keep all the cleared scrub and branches so rather than transport the residue elsewhere we decided on a bonfire. The bonfire was newly built on the day; anything older could have wildlife under it. We can't manage "carbon negative" but at least it was "carbon neutral".

We have been leading the way when it comes to eradicating the use of floral foam and encouraging other churches to develop good churchyard practice. Hopefully floral foam will eventually become a thing of the past. Until that time, we have prepared a place where people can deposit used floral foam. From there we can arrange for its correct disposal and ensure that it doesn't go onto the churchyard green waste heap.

Like other churches in the WWRT we embrace the common rural nature to encourage the biodiversity all around us. We at St Bartholomew's welcome visitors who would like to start the process of gaining Eco Church Status.

Entrance to the church is only allowed via the rear vestry door where new handrails have been installed. This entrance will continue to be used until repairs to the ceiling have been completed.

The chancel will be open for private prayer every Sunday from 3.00pm with said evensong at 3.30pm. Perfect for a pre-tea walk around our churchyard and some quiet time in our church to celebrate our place in this beautiful but troubled world.



#### Introduction

During the four weeks of Advent we will, together, explore the challenges and changes to everyday life we have experienced this year, and look towards the new year with hope in Jesus.

Each of the four sessions take the context and characters from the Christmas story and invite us to make connections with life during the pandemic. We can reflect on our feelings and response to what's happened and come alongside the people in the Christmas story with fresh insight and understanding. 'Now' and 'then' each scene contains a passage from Luke's or Matthew's account of the Christmas story. The connection between 'now' and 'then' is brought to life through a monologue where a voice talks about an aspect of life in the pandemic, and then switches to a voice from a character in the Christmas story. Questions, prayer, and a song to listen will offer different ways into conversation and reflection.

Over the four weeks you are invited to build a nativity scene, in your home whether you are attending through Zoom or socially distanced in person (lockdown permitting), with traditional nativity set figures and symbols representing aspects of life today. This is an optional extra and not part of the actual course.

The four scenes are:

Week 1 Rules and regulations Our response to directives from central authorities alongside life under Roman rule; Nativity: stable and/or empty crib and animals. Mask and pen

Week 2 Unsung heroes The contribution of key workers and the shepherds' key role in telling the Good News; Nativity: the shepherds and angels. Made or drawn rainbow

Week 3 Travelling light Migrants' search for a safe home and the magi's journey to an unknown destination; Nativity: The Wise Men. A glass of water

Week 4 At a distance Family life in lockdown and the Holy Family's isolation at the time of their son's birth; Nativity: Mary and Joseph (and the baby Jesus, unless your tradition is to keep him hidden until Christmas morning). A candle and a family photograph, to add to the nativity scene.

If you don't have a nativity set, there are many templates on the internet with figures to cut out. Do a search on 'nativity set templates' and view it through the Images option.

## Draft Minutes of a virtual meeting of the Shelsleys Parish Council held on November 10th 2020

In Attendance: District Councillor Mrs Caroline Palethorpe, County Councillor Dr Ken Pollock, Mr Simon Durling (MAC) 1 member of the public and the Clerk. Apologies: Mr David Bates, Mr J Stinton, (accepted). There were No Declarations of Interest:

**Minutes**: The minutes of September 15th 2020 were agreed as a true record.

**Public Question Time**: There was a long discussion on the lack of progress for the three projects within the parish which are trying to get properties connected to Superfast Broadband. One project (Project 2) has been told that self-dig is not an option for connection and the price quoted by Openreach is £69,000. No explanation of the cost has been given. The other two projects are still awaiting the results of an Openreach survey which will be sent to Rob Stepniewski at WCC whose job is to help Parish Councils especially with finding funding. County Councillor Pollock sympathised with the lack of progress and requested details be sent to him in order that he may facilitate. 
