STIRLING MOSS HONOURED AT SHELSLEY WALSH

A blue plaque was unveiled at Shelsley Walsh last month as a tribute to legendary racing driver Sir Stirling Moss. The motorsport legend died last April aged 90 and the plaque will honour his achievements as one of Britain's greatest racing drivers.

It was unveiled last month at the Shelsley Walsh hill climb venue during the weekend of the E-type 60 event. The blue plaque has



been commissioned by Worcester Civic Society to commemorate the achievements of eminent people who have had an association with the city and county.



Sir Stirling had а long-standing connection to Shelslev Walsh which is famous the world over for its steep hill climb and hosts many motoring events there. The Formula One star began his long and successful career by entering speed hill climbs, particularly at Shelsley Walsh, and competed there many times. He returned there regularly until his health deteriorated. On show was Sir Stirling's old Jaguar XK 120 that he used to drive all over Europe to races in the early 1950s, and also his Jaguar C-type.

THE LEGEND OF SAPEY BROOK

Mystery has long surrounded a series of footprints in hard rock along a section of Sapey Brook that runs through part of Clifton and Harpley parishes towards Tedstone Delamere. Many years ago, they were even linked to a legend involving St Catherine of Ledbury.

An early mention of them appeared in 1835 under the heading of Observations on certain Curious Indentations in the Old Red Sandstone of Worcestershire and Herefordshire. 'At the Hope Mill, in Sapey Brook, there is a block of stone about a yard and a half long ... on the surface of which there are two foot-prints of a full grown horse, three as of a colt, one patten-ring impression and three other marks...'



The author added: 'The tracks vary in size from each other, and appear to be the prints of various pattens and of several animals, and the horse or mare's tracks are generally larger than those of a common hackney, and appear about the size of those of a market horse, and the pattenring impressions are perfectly circular, like those worn by country people, and made by blacksmiths, and not oval like those of the modern fashion.' Such impressions are known as petrosomatoglyphs and have often been associated with religious symbolism linked to saints, which probably explains how the legend of St Catherine of Ledbury, a 13th century noblewoman, arose.

According to the legend, St Catherine was living at Burton [Burton Court], in Lower Sapey, when 'a girl, having a pair of pattens on, stole the pious lady's mare and colt, and, to avoid detection, led them down the channel of Sapey Brook, and so on through the channels of certain other brooks towards Ledbury. The saint, being informed of her loss, prayed that, wherever the animals and the thief trod, the marks of their feet might be left; accordingly, not only did the ground exhibit these marks, but even the hard rock in the channel of the brook; whereby the thief and her booty were traced, and seized at Ledbury.'

LOCAL AUTHOR'S LATEST CRIME MYSTERY

Teme Valley author, Andy Griffee, is celebrating the publication of *Oxford Blues*, the third book in his ongoing crime mystery series. Andy, who began writing after a 25-year career with the BBC, has had a book published each year for the past three years. The Johnson and Wilde crime mystery series is set on the UK's canals and rivers and his hero, a journalist called Jack Johnson, lives on board a narrowboat.

His debut novel, *Canal Pushers*, was based in the Midlands and featured the Stratford Canal and the Worcester and Birmingham Canal. 'The book begins and ends in Worcester and many local people have told me how much they enjoyed reading about places that they could recognise,' says Andy. His second book, *River Rats*, moved onto the River Avon in Bath and was launched during last year's Covid lockdown. Now, in his latest book, Jack and his partner Nina Wilde, have moved on to Oxford where they moor up on the River Isis. A pair of magnet fishermen discover the body of young female student at a weir and Jack and Nina are quickly drawn into a plot that features corrupt academics, organised criminal gangs, a blackmail operation and various rival love interests.

'My first book was about hatred and my second about greed,' says Andy, 'and I suppose the third is dominated by love and lust. I am interested in the various motives for murder and how they play out.' Once again, the book is inspired by real crime stories - in this case the County Lines activity in Oxford which has involved the exploitation of children by big city gangs for drug dealing and prostitution. Andy managed to do his research in Oxford before the lockdown happened. 'I suppose I'm used to long solitary stretches of writing in my study at home,' he says. 'Only this time, my wife Helen and daughter Ella were both working from home too so it was nice to have some company at lunchtime for a change.'

Andy's publishers, Orphans Publishing of Leominster, marked the launch of Oxford Blues with a party at Hereford Rowing Club. And now he is busy finishing the first draft of the fourth book in the series which he hopes will be published next year.

Cllr Bowden also noted requests for speed bumps or laybys by residents. New Councillor emails have been circulated by the Clerk and uploaded to the website.

Parish Matters / Updates: Village Maintenance Plan – Cllr Gilbert reminded the meeting what had been agreed regarding hanging baskets. R. Wilks hoping to erect them next week. Still awaiting quotes for outstanding matters and delivery of gravel around the conker tree. Hopes to finalise the programme next week. Two new containers, troughs by village entrances. Tree Survey – the meeting noted that a formal survey will cost approx. £500.00 plus vat. Cllr Bowden proposed that the survey go ahead as quoted, seconded Cllr Gilbert. All agreed. Cllr Gilbert to progress. Village Archive – Internal refurbishment now complete. Quote received for desk and shelving was approved. Cllr Gilbert to progress.

Section 106 Matters: Four Acre Field Project – land ownership matters are still to be resolved with MHDC and the Clerk has now contacted a Solicitor to progress this for the Council. All works currently on hold. The Clerk has been liaising with residents regarding any queries.

Planning Matters: Applications for consideration: 21/00861/AGR – Highfield House, Hope Lane, Clifton WR6 6HE – prior notification for purpose-built grain store – No Objection submitted 17/5/21

Notifications: 21/00702/AGR – 1 Noak Farm, Clifton WR6 6DX – prior approval is not required for a steel framed agricultural building.

Strategic Planning Matters: Cllr Gilbert will monitor and notify the Council of any matters which require attention. The meeting noted the current consultation for SWDPR re Traveller and Travelling Show People sites, but there are none within the parish.

Highways & Facilities Matters: Lengthsman tasks – tree has been planted on the corner of Kenelm Close. Trees on the green have been trimmed. New footpath notice board installed – original one damaged by a road sweeper (school have details). Footpath obstructed outside the sub-station has been cleared. R Wilks to add to the maintenance programme. New tubs ordered for the Green. Gravel should be in place next week. Shelves added to the container. Cllr Bowden suggested working with the Scouts initially and then look at space for Footballers. Footpath between Hope Lane and Pound Lane – agreed not to progress this currently. No current road closures. Cllr Bowden still not receiving footpath closure notices.

TEME VALLEY WILDLIFE



I am indebted to David Graham of Knighton-on-Teme for the photograph accompanying this month's article. Thanks are also due for the idea for this article and permission to use his image to promote the Teme Valley Wildlife Group. Although rarely seen, there are plenty of polecats about in the Teme Valley because Wales and its adjoining counties are the most likely places in Britain to spot them. Elusive and wary they keep out of sight but often live quite close to humans, particularly to farms.

Sometimes they can be mistaken for other animals, particularly the wild ferret and the similar-sized but non-native mink. The polecat's characteristic feature is a mask of dark fur on an otherwise pale face which gives a Dick Turpin-esque quality to its physiognomy. Ferrets are domesticated polecats, bred from way back in time for use as rabbit-catchers, and when these animals escape captivity and start to breed in the wild they gradually revert to native polecat colouring. Whilst half-way there, the paler furred "polecat-ferrets" lack the spectacle-like mask. Meanwhile, mink have dark chocolate-brown fur but lack any facial markings.

I have seen polecats on a number of occasions over the years but sadly none of them have looked well. I was once drawn to the odd behaviour of my trio of sheep who stopped to look at something then ran away, then returned for another look, then ran off again. On investigation the cause of their agitation was a not very well-looking polecat which was

out and about in broad daylight and looking distinctly under the weather. It retreated into woodland not to be seen again. My other sightings have been of dead polecats, all come to grief on the A443 between Lindridge Church and Newnham Bridge. Happily, I know that other people spot them alive and well, often on wildlife cameras set up in their gardens.

Polecats have traditionally been unpopular with poultry-keepers and game-keepers and in the past were the objects of persecution. Bounties were once placed on their heads, along with other "vermin", and old churchwardens' accounts sometimes record the sums paid out for killing them. Until 1850 they were widespread across Britain but by 1915 had become confined to their present range. They feed on rabbits, rodents, perching birds, frogs, carrion and large insects. Once the hob and Jill have got together the female finds a suitable hollow to give birth and the young are called kittens, the same names as their domesticated counterparts.

I think that they are very attractive looking animals although like all mustelids they are capable of emitting strong aromas, a fact that apparently protected them from being trapped for their fur. Keep a lookout and you too may be lucky enough to see one or take a photograph.

The next meeting of the Teme Valley Wildlife Group is scheduled for 7:30pm on Thursday July 8th at Lindridge Parish Hall which has facilities to stream a presentation for those preferring to access the talk at home. We welcome back Peter Garner, whose talk is called "The Natural Wonders of Herefordshire". For details of how to join us remotely, please consult our website or Facebook page. Everyone is most welcome. There will be no entry charge for those attending in person, but as future restrictions remain unclear, please check before setting out that the meeting is indeed taking place.



HARPLEY CHURCH ROOF AND CEILING REPAIR.

In the meantime, we held a wedding with a gathering of 24 young and 6 old. It was magical, the weather and the ceiling were kind. Without doubt it will be remembered - The beauty of the bride and groom, the church, the vicars and the witnesses are beyond description.

(along with most dioceses in the land) are having to make cutbacks in the amount of clergy they employ because the finances are not there to support them. I have said it before and I will say it again, the ministry of a Parish Priest is supported by local donations, there is no central support from the Church of England or government each parish makes a donation towards the cost of a clergy person and at present the amount of funding coming in means there is need to make reductions in the amount of



stipendiary clergy available. The lack of funds coming in to the church during the pandemic has also been an issue but we do hope as the churches open up the local parishes can start to thrive again. I thank everyone who endeavours to help with the church income and ministry to enable us to do the work we do.

The Parish does not own the Rectory and it is the diocese who have the right to sell when they need to do so. This does not mean you do not have a Vicar/ Rector, at the moment that is me (Rev Canon David Sherwin), and we are blessed with other staff in the area who are a tremendous asset to the ministry of the Church. We have our local Priest, the Rev Jen Denniston, Readers Pat Snelling and Jill Smith and other licenced lay workers who will aid us in our ministry along with our Team Vicar Rev Anne Potter and associate priest Jennifer Whittaker.

I wish you to know we are there for you whether we live in the parish or not. Together we can keep the churches ministry of the Gospel of Christ active and living. God bless.

- Fridays at the Nora Parsons Centre, Wichenford.


