
ACTIVITEAS





Minutes of the annual meeting of Clifton Parish Council on Thursday 5th Parish Council May 2022 Clifton upo



Present: Councillors J. Bowden (Chairman), A. Henry (Vice-Chairman), R. Henry, B. Gilbert, N. Campsall and P. Brooks. Also present: 14 members of the public.

Election of Chairman: It was proposed by Cllr A. Henry, seconded Cllr Gilbert that Cllr Bowden remain as Chairman. All agreed.

Apologies for absence: Cllr L. Merrick, County Cllr D. Chambers and District Cllr C. Palethorpe.

Election of Vice Chairman: It was proposed by Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr Gilbert that Cllr A. Henry remain as Vice Chairman. All agreed.

Declarations of Interests and applications for Councillor dispensations: None. Councillors are reminded to renew their Registers of Interests for publication on the PC website.

Democratic Public Time: The meeting noted the current position on the s106 project land ownership legal matters and the fact that an application has now been made to Land Registry. A new play area at Alfrick has been completed and Cllr Campsall is going to arrange a visit to see what has been achieved.

Committees and Working Groups: The Council agreed delegated authority to the Urgent Business Committee of Cllrs Bowden, A. Henry and the Clerk. The Council appointed Cllrs Bowden, A. Henry and Campsall to the Finance Working Group. Proposed Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr Gilbert, all agreed.

Financial Regulations, Risk Assessments and Insurance Policy: It was agreed that the Finance Working Group review these documents and report to a future meeting.

Councillor Roles: (See also 08.22) It was agreed that bank account authorisers are Cllrs Bowden, A. Henry and Gilbert. It was agreed that Worcs CALC Reps are Cllrs Bowden and Gilbert.

To agree the Minutes of the meeting held 7th April 2022 – Minutes were proposed by Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr Brooks and agreed by all.

Matters arising: R. Wilks to quote for the rec. field gate. R. Wilks has the planter, not the sign as minuted. Defib cabinet has arrived to be erected. Hanging baskets are to be re-hung for June. Pavilion repairs have started. Cllr Bowden is liaising re the footpaths map. History Room chairs are now in position. The plaque on the Church wall will be erected on 30th May. Minute 148.21.04 was amended to read Cllr A. Henry. The marquee has been purchased and a trial run to erect it will be held in May.

District & County Councillor Reports: Reports circulated prior to the meeting were noted and will be uploaded to the website. The footpath (north) has been marked up now – this was on Cllr Chambers list of actions. The meeting noted concerns regarding cuts to bus service provision.

Financial & Governance Matters: Payments and receipts – the schedule was agreed as circulated. Clerk to arrange payments. An additional payment of up to £600.00 was approved to purchase the new marquee – to be confirmed next meeting. Insurance claim – work on the pavilion has started, and the claim has been submitted.

Parish Matters/Updates: Village Maintenance Plan - Cllr Gilbert reported that hanging baskets are being replanted for June. The conker tree works are awaiting approval from WCC. The sign in the grass verge by the tree needs to be lifted higher and R. Wilks is to be asked to do this work. It was noted that some signs have been erected on the Village Green without permission of the PC – it was agreed to monitor and remove as appropriate. The History Room – The name has been changed recently and the facility is now ready for use. There will be an Open Day on 3rd June. RoSPA Report on the play area - Cllr Brooks reported on actions that are needed to improve safety. Clerk to ask R. Wilks to undertake the work needed. Also, to arrange mole removal. Recreation field weed management: Local concerns re recent weed killing were noted. The Clerk confirmed that the spray used meets safety requirements and is used under licence on amenity areas. There have been no previous safety incidents. Platinum Jubilee events – Cllr A. Henry reported that items have been purchased and food arranged. A walk on Sunday morning is now arranged. A delivery list for food is being arranged together with invitations and offers of lifts for those who need one. The Brownies and Rainbows have made some bunting Section 106 Matters: Four Acre Field (CFAF) Project - Cllr Campsall is engaging with MHDC and looking at procurement processes. The project may need to be presented again to the S106 Group at MHDC due to delays and cost changes. The Clerk is arranging Land Registry documents for MHDC together with progressing the Land Registry application. The Clerk was asked to confirm current legal costs and Land Reg fees.

Planning Matters: Applications to consider - 22/000529/HP – 11 Woodmanton Close, WR6 6DG – single storey rear extension and two storey side extension - No objections. Notifications received – none.

Strategic Planning Matters: Cllr Gilbert will monitor the SWDPR and notify the Council of any matters which require attention. The summer consultation has been postponed.

Highways & Facilities Matters: Lengthsman tasks are progressing well. A road sweep by MHDC is to be requested by the Clerk. County Cllr Chambers has been sent a list of outstanding Highways tasks by Cllr Bowden. Cllr Brooks suggested a new pathway in the village by Manor Rd as it's currently very narrow and people are using an alternate route across the Green. The land isn't PC owned and is maintained by the Housing Assoc currently, and it was agreed to try and contact them.

Next meeting: Thurs 9th June 2022 due to the Jubilee Bank Holiday.

CLIFTON PARISH COUNCIL draft Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held 5th May 2022 at Clifton upon Teme Village Hall at 7 pm

Present: Parish Councillors J. Bowden (Chairman), A. Henry (V/ Chairman), P. Brooks, N. Campsall, R. Henry, B. Gilbert and 14 members of the public.

Apologies: County Cllr D. Chambers, District Cllr C. Palethorpe, Parish Councillor L. Merrick, PSCO V. Snape, H. Wain, J. Wain, J. Johns, P. Arthur, M. Dayson, J. Pound and C & H Hurley.

Confirmation of the Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 6th May 2021:

The Minutes were confirmed as a true record. Proposed Cllr A. Henry, seconded Cllr B. Gilbert. All agreed.

Report of the Parish Council Chairman J. Bowden: Councillor Bowden reported that Parish Council meetings are now 'open meetings' with everyone welcome to attend and speak on any local matter. Efforts are being made to welcome Ukrainian refugees to the village but are hampered by Government processes. The PC has been very active over the past 12 months and many issues addressed including safety works to the pavilion, vehicle activated speed signs, maintenance to the Bowling Green, completion of the new History Room, funding towards church projects, a new defibrillator to be positioned outside Yeomans Garage, a village tree survey and tree preservation works, replacement of the old W.I. bench and new village waste bins. Carols on the Green was also a great success and a new marguee for this year has already been purchased. Village street furniture has been replaced or repainted and hanging baskets are due to be re-hung shortly – this has resulted in many compliments! Thanks to all Councillors who have helped organise these things.

Footpath works have taken place including new bridges at Woodmanton, the sewage works and at Hill Farm. There have been new finger posts installed at the road junctions of all the paths within the parish. A new gate has been provided at the recreation ground and further works are being progressed. Worcs CC s106 funding has provided new accessible crossings at Manor Rd and Hope Lane and also a new weekly bus service to Malvern via Suckley & Alfrick. Progress on the new play equipment at the recreation ground has been slow due to land ownership legal matters which have to be resolved via Land Registry,

but an ownership application has now been submitted and we hope to progress the project again shortly. Cllr Campsall has kindly agreed to be the Project Manager going forward. The Parish Council do occasionally receive letters of concern from residents and whilst the minutes of PC meetings are published in Teme Triangle, we also encourage residents to attend our meetings to raise concerns about local matters. The PC agreed not to raise the precept this year for a third successive year and that has resulted in an actual decrease in the cost to each household, partly as a result of increased population in the new housing schemes. The Chairman thanked all Councillors and the Clerk for their work this year. Also, previous Councillors Chris Hayward and Julie Collins. The meeting welcomed new Councillors Nathan Campsall, Paul Brooks and Lyn Merrick. Best wishes to all Clifton residents.

Reports: Reports were made to the meeting by the following organisations – Bowls Club – Tony Wilson, Royal British Legion & Poppy Appeal – Jack Whittenbury, Clifton Rovers FC – Mark Dayson by email, Police – PSCO V. Snape by email, St Kenelms P.C.C. – Mike Snelling, Tenbury Transport Trust – Louise Taylor, Guides & Scouts – Angie Griffiths (and for Helen Wain), Clifton Craft Group – Ruth Wilson, Clifton W.I. – Penny Bowden, Clifton Village Hall – Mandy Henry.

<u>Midland Automobile Club:</u> The Parish Council has been impressed by the recent events at Shelsley Walsh which have all been held without causing problems to local residents. The new signage has worked well and has removed traffic driving through the village. The clerk to enquire whether the signage is permanent and to thank the MAC for the efforts and progress made.

<u>Lengthsman:</u> There has been no contact with the lengthsman since the annual contract was sent to him, the clerk to check on him



Clifton Parish Council Annual Report – May 2022

The last couple of years have been very difficult for all of



us, with the Covid pandemic now followed by the terrible war in Ukraine. Our condolences go out to residents who have become infected or lost loved ones during the pandemic. Efforts are being made to welcome some Ukrainian Refugees to the village but are hampered by the government accreditation processes.

Despite the constraints of social distancing and restrictions on public meetings your Council has been very active over the past 12 months. Many issues have been addressed, including safety work to the Pavilion; VAS monitors to try to reduce vehicles speed through the village; maintenance works to the bowling green; completion and opening of the new History Room; provision of partial funding for the disabled access to the Church; a new defibrillator to be positioned outside Yeoman's Garage; a survey of trees within the village, which has resulted in tree surgery to preserve our trees. The WI bench on the Green has been replaced, together with the provision of a new waste bins, also at the recreation ground. 'Carols on the Green' was a great success, with an estimated 200 people on the Green. It will again take place this year, with a slightly amended format and some attention paid to the sound and seating. We have already purchased a new marquee.

Work to the footpaths have included new bridges at Woodmanton, the sewage works and at Hill Farm. The most visible new addition to the footpaths has been the provision of new finger posts at the road junctions of all the paths within the parish. A new gate has been provided on the path through the Recreation Ground and other gates to replace stiles are in progress, but this is only possible with the consent of the landowners.

Bruce Gilbert has done a sterling job in getting most of the street furniture replaced or re-painted and also organising the hanging baskets. We have received more compliments and thanks for this than all the other work together! S106 Funding from the new houses at The Meadows and The View has provided new mobility impaired crossings at Manor Road and Hope Land and a new weekly bus service to Malvern which is used sparingly. More funding is due from the site at Hope Land as and when the houses are sold.

Progress on improving the facilities at the Recreation Ground has been hampered by a problem proving we owned all the land. This has resulted in a protracted and expensive process of obtaining evidence to satisfy the demands of the Land Registry but we can now confirm that the details have been submitted. This will now allow new quotes to be obtained, but as construction costs have risen by some 20% over the last two years, the scope of the works will have to be reduced. Nathan Campsall has kindly agreed to lead the team on this matter and we hope to commence work later this year.

Minutes of our meetings are published both in Teme Triangle and on the village website and we urge villagers to attend our meetings to raise their concerns. Despite the obvious financial pressures, we have agreed not to raise the precept for a third successive year. This has resulted in a decrease in the actual cost to each property, partly as a result of the increased population from the new housing schemes.

I would personally like to thank all our councillors for their work during this last year and send best wishes to Chris Hayward and Julie Collins who have resigned this year. We welcome their replacements: Paul Brooks, Nathan Campsall and Lynn Merrick who is currently recovering from a back problem.

Finally, special thanks to our Clerk, Michelle Alexander, who works tirelessly to keep us all within the rules.
