

SHELSLEYS SUPERFAST BROADBAND LATEST

Another broadband Fibre To The Property (FTTP) scheme has gone live to a community in the Teme Valley. Thirty properties in Camp Lane, Kingswood Lane and Stanford Road have now been told that the infrastructure work by Openreach engineers has been completed. The project, which is co-funded by Worcestershire County Council and the Government, has taken just over a year to complete. Community organiser Brian Meddings has now advised all of the homeowners who signed up for the scheme that they now need to choose a new fibre broadband supplier. It is anticipated that much faster download and upload broadband speeds will now be possible for homeowners and home-business people.





CLIFTON PARISH COUNCIL LATEST

Clifton parish councillors have written to the Worcestershire Area Health Authority to protest at the decision by the Knightwick Surgery to close the weekly surgery in the village hall in Clifton, following complaints by local residents that they now have to travel to Knightwick to collect 'controlled and temperature sensitive drugs'. In the letter, copied to Harriet Baldwin MP, the parish council suggests 'one solution would be a refrigerated van, under the control of a medically qualified person, could visit Clifton at an agreed weekly time and date, to enable parishioners to collect their prescriptions'.

Clifton Parish Council has also written to Malvern Hills District Council objecting to a bid by the developer of the Blue Shot site in Pound Lane, Clifton, to add a further three houses to the five already proposed for the site. The Parish Council has also objected to a proposal to add further housing on the site currently being developed in Hope Lane.

In a letter to MHDC, the Council says: 'Despite two completed developments and the development in progress at Hope Lane, nothing has been done to provide extra facilities to service the increase in population within the parish. Worse than that, Malvern Hills D.C's strange policy of not allowing S106 funds to be spent on Parish Council owned land has seriously devalued the value of this funding. This issue is still outstanding, the full details having been with the Land Registry for over a year. Building any housing in the area of Hope Lane shown in plan will be subject to the constant noise emanating from the sewage works, making them potentially unsalable.'

Minutes of Clifton Parish Council held Thursday 5th January 2023

Present: Councillors J. Bowden (Chairman), A. Henry (Vice-Chairman), R. Henry, B. Gilbert, N. Campsall, L. Merrick and P. Brooks.

Also present: County Cllr D. Chambers, District Councillor Paul Cummings and 9 members of the public. Apologies for absence: District Cllr C. Palethorpe.

Democratic Public Time: Members of the public raised the following issues –

Forge Meadows – trip hazards are being caused by Severn Trent Water raised water meters which are proud of the pavements which have sunk. STW have already been made aware of the issue and the meters have been spray painted blue, but the PC was asked to also report which was agreed.

Doctors' surgery provision - the meeting heard concerns about the lack of local provision for the village. Patients now have to go to Knightwick Surgery or elsewhere, although some non-restricted items may be collected from the village stores. Knightwick Surgery has confirmed that this new arrangement is not going to change, and Cllr A. Henry confirmed that the Village Hall Committee had no choice in this decision and have tried really hard to retain the local facility previously offered. It was agreed that the Clerk should write to Knightwick Surgery, Harriet Baldwin MP and the Care Commission Group to request that local services be reinstated as the village is expanding and there is also a growing number of elderly residents. The letter will also raise concern about fridge items which now have to be transported by patients back to their homes and may risk deterioration. The question was also raised about the availability of a prescription delivery service to patient's homes which appears to be available in Tenbury Wells - could this not be expanded? County Cllr Chambers will also raise these matters at the WCC Health Overview & Scrutiny Committee to see the county overview of similar rural issues.

Concerns were raised regarding the **South Worcs Development Plan** and proposed development for the village as included in the SWDP review and Reg 19 consultation. Cllr Gilbert responded and confirmed that the PC have checked the SWDP thoroughly and confirmed that Hope Lane site wouldn't be able to more than the agreed 30 dwellings as defined within the Neighbourhood Development Plan, which is valid until 2030 and has been agreed and validated by MHDC. There has

been no formal planning application submitted for the site to date, but Cllrs Bowden and Gilbert agreed to monitor this closely. District Cllr Cummings clarified the current position with the review of the SWDP and Neighbourhood Development Plan. The meeting noted the need to ensure that the Neighbourhood Plan is reviewed appropriately. District Cllr Cummings agreed to provide more data to the next meeting.

The Minutes of the meeting held 1st December 2022 were agreed by all. No further matters arising.

District & County Councillor Reports: Any reports received will be circulated and uploaded to the website. Cllr R. Henry asked County Cllr Chambers to provide data on tree planting across the county and what the after care package is for them? Concerns have been raised that many are dying for lack of care or have been inappropriately planted. Cllr Chambers also reported on county health matters, including a new referral unit at Worcs Royal Hospital. The new A&E dept is due to open in May this year. Cllr Bowden is to liaise with Cllr Chambers on outstanding County Highways matters.

The Clerk is to chase up road sweeping with MHDC. It was agreed by the PC to progress the residents survey regarding bus stops/shelters whilst Worcs CC are reviewing all elements of bus provision across the county. Cllr Bowden will draft the survey and circulate to the PC for review.

Cllr Brooks reported to the meeting about footpath matters and the open trench at The View – all matters are being actively progressed. Cllr Brooks has arranged a site visit later this month with Cllr Chambers.

Financial & Governance Matters: Payments and receipts - the schedule was as circulated and was proposed by Cllr Gilbert, seconded Clir A. Henry. All agreed. Clerk to arrange payments. Budget & Precept 2023/24 – the draft budget had been circulated prior to the meeting. It was proposed by Cllr Bowden, seconded by Cllr R. Henry to retain the precept at £30k p.a. and to make no increase as sufficient reserves were already in place. All agreed. Clerk to notify MHDC. Quotes for spring/ summer hanging baskets and grass mowing had been received from R. Wilks. The quotes were proposed for acceptance by Cllr A. Henry, seconded Cllr Gilbert, all agreed. Clerk to notify. The Clerk's resignation had been withdrawn and the Clerk is to remain as contracted. Cllr Bowden proposed that the quote from Rewired for electrical works at the pavilion should be accepted and works progressed. Seconded Cllr Gilbert. All agreed. Cllr Bowden to arrange works. It was agreed that the Clerk should order three new dark green waste bins to replace the remaining old bins.

Parish Matters/Updates: Village Maintenance Plan – no further updates. Community Speed Watch – Worcs CC survey data is awaited. Village Nursery & Preschool Community Funding – they group hope to attend the next PC meeting – defer to the next agenda. Street & gutter cleaning – Worcs CC has confirmed that a second Lengthsman may be appointed by the PC, subject to training. Cllr Bowden asked that the matter be deferred currently – agreed. Parish defibrillators – Cllr Brooks has checked them all and confirmed that they are all working properly. Spare defib pads are also available and info will be sent to Councillors. Cllr A. Henry is progressing the 'on call' rota scheme for defibs via West Mids Ambulance Service / Community First Responders.

Section 106 Matters: Four Acre Field (CFAF) Project –Land Registry matters are ongoing via the Solicitors – Clerk to request a further update. Cllr Gilbert has chased the matter up formally with Harriet Baldwin MP but is awaiting a full response. Cllr Campsall is progressing the project in the meantime and gave an update re the scope of the works and negotiations with contractors. S106 funding remains allocated via MHDC. District Cllr Cummings agreed to look in to s106 matters with MHDC and will liaise with the Clerk.

Planning Matters: Applications for consideration -

M/22/01711/HP – 4 Manor Rd, Clifton upon Teme WR6 6EA – erection of a single storey rear and side extension. No objections raised.

M/22/01679/HP – Honey Bee Cottage, 42 The Village, Clifton upon Teme WR6 6DH – proposed demolition of fire damaged lean to and provision of rear elevation single storey kitchen extension with associated internal space planning. No objections raised.

M/22/01682/FUL – Blue Shot Meadow, Pound Lane, Clifton upon Teme WR6 6DE – proposed residential development of 3 dwellings. Residents raised significant concerns regarding development on this site. Cllr Bowden confirmed the Parish Council position on development at Blue Shot to date and the response submitted to MHDC previously. Residents raised a number of concerns to the meeting re this application, which were noted, and they were asked to respond to MHDC individually to make a larger impact / response. Further to significant discussion, it was agreed that Cllrs Bowden and Gilbert should draft a full objection which once agreed by the PC, can be submitted by the Clerk. District Cllr Cummings also offered to look at current enforcement issues on site on behalf of residents and advised residents on how to monitor their concerns formally.

Strategic Planning Matters: Cllr Gilbert will monitor the SWDPR and notify the Council of any matters to be considered.

Highways & Facilities Matters: Lengthsman matters are all progressing well. County Matters – Cllr Bowden is to liaise with County Cllr Chambers re a list of outstanding works and requested updates. Road closures – none received recently.

Councillors Reports & Items for Future Agendas: Cllr A. Henry suggested the village should celebrate the Coronation, as Carols on the Green and Jubilee celebrations had been very successful. Those involved with Carols on the Green recently, were thanked for their help. Cllr Henry agreed to progress matters.

Cllr Bowden is to arrange a Coronation plaque for the Church through a local stonemason. Quotes to be obtained for consideration. R. Wilks has cut back the hedge and tree in Pound Lane as requested.



Church Matters

Nationally and internationally, who knows. What we do know is that the potential cost of living increases will result in many folk struggling to feed themselves and to keep warm during the long winter days; that there is a high chance that more people will lose their homes and end up living on the street; that the war in Ukraine is



unlikely to come to an end this month; that there could be more strikes disrupting people's lives and adding to the stress and strain of general living, especially those requiring medical help.

Not all doom and gloom.....

There are good things about February. The days get longer giving us more daylight hours. Valentine's day on February 14th reminding us of love for one another. The next month March is spring and often during February we see the first signs as the snowdrops flower and the early lambs are seen frolicking in the fields.

In the Christian liturgical year at the beginning of February on the second we remember Jesus being taken as a young baby to the temple by his parents Mary and Joseph as part of their Jewish faith ritual. (Many churches will celebrate Candlemas/Presentation of Jesus at the temple on 29th January). It was on this occasion an old priest, Simeon, and an old prophetess, Anna, who lived in the temple fasting and praying 24 hours, knew that the young baby being presented at the temple was the promised Messiah.

Simeon took the baby Jesus into his arms and praising God says the words of the Nunc Dimittis (which is often read at funerals)

'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word;

for my eyes have seen your salvation,

which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for the glory to your people Israel.' (Luke 2:29-32)

The joy of meeting the new Saviour, God's son, is tinged with sorrow as Simeon tells Jesus' mother Mary that 'a sword will pierce your own soul too' (Luke 2:35).

Simeon is predicting the pain Mary will experience when her son is cruelly put to death on a cross. However, Simeon is now ready to die in peace having seen his Lord face to face in God incarnate, a tiny human baby.

February 2023 we will start our journey towards remembering that day – Good Friday – on Wednesday 22nd February, in our Ash Wednesday service at Heaton House (details elsewhere). Not forgetting, of course, Shrove Tuesday the night before when we clear our larders and eat lots of pancakes before commencing the six weeks of Lent. The annual time of fasting and penitence in the Christian calendar leading to the most important week of the Christian year, Holy week, culminating in the Easter celebration of new life – the resurrection of Jesus Christ which this year falls on April 9th.

There is a light at the end of the February dark tunnel – the light that came into the darkness at Christmas time is revealed to us through the eyes of an old man. That light which is there for all of us – even in the dark times, though we may not always see it.

Wishing you a February that is not all gloom and doom...look for those glimpses of light and celebrate times of joy and blessings.

Guest Column by Harriett Baldwin MP

The Christmas decorations are packed away for another year, and the trees and wrapping paper are off to be recycled. January is often a difficult month with many people struggling to keep their New Year resolutions – some raising money for a good cause and some just because a new year means a fresh start. Of course, the extra spending over December could mean that people have money worries and I urge anyone who has concerns to raise them early. Our local Citizens Advice Bureau is a great resource which can offer help and for those with debt problems and the Government has implemented a range of support packages, especially for those with



lower incomes, to help get through the winter months as worry-free as possible.

The National Health Service is front of our minds at this time of year when staff have to deal with the extra winter pressures caused by the Christmas break and the number of extra bugs being spread around as families gather together for the festive period. I was pleased to hear that some of the new buildings have now been opened up for patients at Worcestershire Royal Hospital – part of a £15 million to give us all a new Emergency Department adding significant extra bed capacity. The full handover can't come quickly enough but I hope that this year will see significant improvement in waiting time reductions for those at A&E. Wintertime inevitably brings heavier rain and my thoughts return to all of those who are still at risk of flooding – especially the communities of Tenbury Wells and Severn Stoke. I'm keeping a close eye on both flood defence plans and hope that we will see spades in the ground very soon for both Environment Agency schemes.

Parliament is now back in session and the Prime Minister has set out a five point plan to deal with the issues that you care about most – the economy, our national debt, the NHS, inflation and illegal immigration. I know these are your priorities too and our New Year's resolutions must also involve continuing to support Ukraine against invasion.
