Governors don't get involved with the day to day running of a school, instead supporting and challenging the school's leadership team to drive school improvement. They champion the work the school does.

School governors have three main roles:

- Governors ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.

 The governing hadri halps to get language for the cable decided.
- The governing body helps to set long-terms plans for the school, decide where improvements need to be made and how to make them.
- Governors hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and the effective and efficient performance management of staff.

The governing body looks at the quality of education being offered and ensures the head is doing everything possible to improve results.

• Governors oversee the financial performance of the school and make sure its money is well spent.

Governors examine budgets and spending proposals to monitor whether the school is getting value for money and ensure the money is spent in the right areas.

The governors come from the local community and in their role they:

- get to know the school, including visiting the school occasionally during school hours and in agreement with the headteacher, and gaining a good understanding of the school's strengths and weaknesses.
- attend induction training and regular relevant training and development events.
- attend meetings (approximately four full governing board meetings and three committee meetings a year) and read all the papers before the meeting.
- act in the best interests of all the pupils of the school.
- behave in a professional manner, as set down in the governing board's code of conduct, including acting in strict confidence.

Guest Column by Harriett Baldwin MP

Later this year, we will celebrate two important improvements to our local health service. The Three Counties Medical School, in Worcester, will welcome its first students training the next generation of doctors. I am told that half of the intake will be domestic students and, recently, I joined a group of local MPs pressing the Health Secretary to fund more places for UK medical students as soon as possible. There's huge demand for people to study medicine locally and in the long-run, this will help us to fill more vacancies at our local hospitals and GP surgeries.



We will also celebrate the opening of the new £22 million Emergency Department which I was lucky enough to tour as work concludes. It has a separate reception areas for adults and children, and a new admission area for ambulances. I've lobbied a succession of Ministers to fund this transformation and I am extremely hopeful that this will make a huge difference to the way people access emergency care.

I have also been encouraged by reports from the local health service managers about the way people access their GP. Recent figures show that our local GPs are performing well above the national average. Waiting times for elective surgery have been significantly reduced and response time for less serious 'category 2' incidents are now down to 24 minutes. Higher proportions of people can get an appointment with their GP within two weeks and GPs are offering 17 per cent more appointments – that's 2,962 more than the equivalent month before the pandemic. The Government has just announced £645 million to help free up GP appointments by helping pharmacists to see more people.

Next month, the NHS will celebrate its 75th birthday and it is truly our most prized national asset and locally, we continue to see significant investment in buildings and staff to make sure that the NHS is able to give the best possible care for us and our loved ones and ensure the service is very much fit for the future.

Church Matters

For me, and maybe for you also, I find it difficult to comprehend that by the time this article is published, the longest day will have passed, spring has been left behind and hopefully we are enjoying some long warm summer



days. The seasons come and go with what seems ever increasing speed. We notice this in the church, because the church uses what we call liturgical colours during the seasons.

The church uses one of four colours for its altar linen, robes and vestments. The colour reflects the seasons:

Advent, purple a colour of royalty, because we are preparing to welcome the coming of a King.

Christmas and Easter, white or gold for the times of joy and celebration Red to celebrate Pentecost, (Whit Sunday) and Saint's days through the year. Green symbolises all living things, renewal and promise of new life.

When you walk into St Kenelm's at any time of the year you will see the vestments and hangings in the appropriate colour for the season.

Now, following Trinity Sunday which was celebrated 4th June we have entered the green season, also sometimes referred to as ordinary time, and this will continue until Advent Sunday 29th November leading to Christmas.

At this time of year, I think, maybe, most of us are somewhat glad to have left the excitement of Christmas, and Easter, together with all the other beautiful Christian festivals, and are looking forward to having a peaceful summer.

So, in St Kenelm's, we now have green vestments, for green is used as the colour for growing things, plants and trees, and this is also because in the church, this is the period of steady spiritual growth, when we can reflect on what we learnt at Christmas and Easter and put it into practice by living a kind and compassionate life.

However, we all know that the ups and downs of world events, and life in general, eventually impinge on us all, so during this time of spiritual growth, we can build the firm foundations to our lives, to help to withstand the storms of life which may come our way, and the words of Jesus will help us to do this.
