VIEW FROM THE FARM

The first of an occasional column from local farmers:

To introduce myself, I am Allan Jeffries and together with my wife Fiona, we farm in Pudford Lane, so you could say we live on the border between Martley and Shelsley Beauchamp. David Moore would probably say we speak more with a Martley accent, not sure if by this he means we swear more!



We farm on a small scale by today's standards,

I'm certainly not impressed with the growth of what I call factory farming in the livestock sector. Pigs and poultry have been farmed intensively indoors for years and now the dairy industry is going the same way. We keep around 230 ewes and I do a bit of fencing, but my core business is sending Fi out to work! We keep Suffolk X Welsh Mule, or Welsh Mule sheep, I like a bit of Welsh breeding in the ewes because I think they do make good mothers at lambing time. We use Charollais rams and start lambing about the first or second week of March. Often after a mild January and February, winter decides to appear just at the start of lambing which is not pleasant at two or three o'clock in the morning, especially if you have a few problem lambings. At times like that I often think "what am I doing this for?" but all that is forgotten when you first turn a nice bunch of ewes and their lambs out to grass on a fine early spring day.



At this time of year, we are weaning the lambs from their mothers which means there is quite a bit of bleating for a couple of days, although I think some of the ewes are quite pleased to have their lambs taken away so they can have a rest from two large lambs bunting at them for milk. Following weaning, all the ewes are sorted and any old ewes who have lost their teeth or ones that have had problems such as mastitis

or severe foot problems are culled and new younger ewes are bought to replace them. It is this time of year that one or two farmer's wives or partners get a bit nervous in case they are exchanged for a younger model!

The weather has been very mixed throughout July, what I term as a 'daggeldy' time, so by the time you read this I hope all the harvest and hay-making has been done and is safely in the barn.

To celebrate, the girls and their schoolfriends, some of whom received Highly Commended certificates, were joined by Josh Cotterill of West Midlands Ambulance Service (pictured with the girls) who was able to show them round the vehicle and explain the busy role of a paramedic for real. They also won Amazon gift vouchers.

Charlotte said: "Our inspiration came from the lessons that we did in school all about the NHS. We loved learning all about the different jobs and when we researched the paramedic job role, we were fascinated to find out what their typical day was like. We also spoke to people in school and one member of staff had a friend who was a paramedic so we were able to ask some extra questions that helped us with our competition entry."

Alice added: "We loved the NHS project as it opened our eyes to how important the NHS is to all of our lives and just how many people they help every day. It made us realise that any skill can be useful for a career in the NHS. We felt that using animation would help people to understand the work of a paramedic much better and maybe inspire people to become paramedics or work for the NHS in the future. We are very proud that we have been chosen to be national winners and we hope that people enjoy watching our video."

Step into the NHS is an exciting resource and school careers competition that raises awareness of the more than 350 career opportunities in the NHS, while supporting the career aspirations of young people in education.


LOCAL AUTHOR'S FIRST CHILDREN'S BOOK

700 RIVERS PUPILS HOLD RALLY AT SHELSLEY HILL CLIMB

Hundreds of pupils from 15 Rivers CofE Academy Trust schools across the region put their Design Technology skills to the test at a special Box Car Rally at the Shelsley Walsh Hill Climb in July.

The talented 10 and 11 year olds had spent many weeks preparing for the event, only the second of its kind, as part of the DT National Curriculum. In total 22 teams and 700 Year 6 children took part, from schools in Worcester, Great Witley, Droitwich, Stourport, Kidderminster, Dudley and Tipton. Taking pole position at the end of the day was the team from Great Witley CofE Primary School, with a Ghostbusters-themed entry.

Co-organiser Emily Calvert, Head at North Worcester Primary Academy, told *Teme Triangle*: "We devised the Rally to bring together all our pupils' DT learning from the past six years. Each class agreed a theme for their entry and set up four sub-groups: a Mechanics team to devise the box car's moving parts; a Structures team to design the bodywork; a Textiles team to create the driver's boilersuit and themed outfits for a parade; and a Food Technology team to prepare refreshments."

Young drivers then put the cars through their paces over a short stretch of track at the base of the Hill Climb, before stopping accurately in a marked box.

Emily confirmed: "Working together towards this Rally built a real partnership between children from many different backgrounds – a whole team ethos. From health & safety to food hygiene and event organisation, it brought learning to life by solving real world problems. The children loved it. Thanks to all involved. It was a fantastic achievement!"

Draft Minutes of the Shelsleys Parish Council Meeting, July 11

Present: Val Jones (Chairwoman), Louise Hutton (Vice-Chair), Laura Taylor, John Stinton, Dave Bates, Jean Hammond, Carole Warren and David Belfield. District Councillor Pam Cumming and the clerk. Apologies: Karen Metcalfe (accepted). Paul Cumming District Councillor and David Chambers County Councillor.

Minutes: The Minutes of May 16th 2023 were accepted and agreed as a true record. The Chairman gave a vote of thanks to the outgoing Chairman Dr Laura Taylor on behalf of all the members.

District and County Councillor Reports: County Councillor Chambers sent a written report. District Councillor Pam Cumming read out a report and answered questions.

Midland Automobile Club: It was agreed that the Parish Council had nothing to report to the MAC as all the recent events had run with no problem whatsoever.

Big Help Out: The nationwide initiative following the coronation was discussed and it was suggested that volunteers, especially those who maybe have not volunteered before, could be involved in a community event. Discussion on what this might be will be canvassed and reported in September.

Progress Reports: Superfast Broadband: The clerk has been informed that the Camp Lane/Birch Berrow/Manor Lane project installation is to start in July and finish in September.

Defibrillator: Access to the equipment is by calling the emergency services. Mobile phones should be able to connect to this even if there is no regular network available.

Speeding signage. Various wording for temporary roadside warning signs was discussed. Clerk to contact WCC via the County Councillor for assistance.

Police Charter. The clerk to enquire on how contact information may be made available to the public.

Highways: The Lengthsman's worksheet for June was inspected and accepted. Pard House Lane road surface and water issues. Work will commence July 31st. Cllr Stinton gave some historical background and he and Cllr Belfield offered to meet with the workforce to explain this.

Speeding. The clerk had made contact with CSO Theresa Howells Tenbury Police with regard to speeding both through the villages and from visitors to and from the hill climb. Currently awaiting an update to the suggestion that the police put an article in the Teme Triangle or leaflet drivers on event days. It was thought signage rather than leaflets would be more effective, clerk to enquire.

Overgrown hedges are reducing the width of narrow lanes. Clerk to request information from WCC on whose responsibility maintaining hedges is and if and how frequently highways cut them. It is understood nothing can be done until September, because of nesting birds, unless a danger is caused.

Parish Map: It was agreed to donate the small map to the PCC for display in All Saints' Church.

Urgent Decisions: Planning application M/23/00572/HP The Manor Barn Shelsley Beauchamp. Application was supported by Councillors and the clerk reported this to MHDC support.

The clerk explained the scheme of delegation whereby the clerk submitted comments made by Councillors to MHDC when planning applications were received between meetings.

Correspondence & Consultations: All relevant mail was either circulated by email to members or was available and discussed at the meeting.

The Audit Exemption certificate has been acknowledged by PFK Littlejohn the External Auditor

Councillors' Reports and items for future agenda. Bleed Out Kit. It was agreed that one should be purchased and placed in the defibrillator box if this is feasible. The clerk will make enquiries for the Chairmen Board at the village hall to be updated.

Minutes of Clifton Parish Council meeting Thursday 7 July 2023

Present: Councillors J. Bowden, B. Gilbert, P. Brooks, R. Neave, L. Merrick. Also present: 8 members of the public and District Cllrs Paul & Pam Cumming. Apologies for absence: County Cllr D. Chambers.

To agree the Minutes of the meetings held 1st & 29th June 2023 – Minutes for 1st June were proposed by Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr Gilbert. Minutes for 29th June were proposed Cllr Brooks, seconded Cllr Gilbert. All agreed.

Democratic Public Time: Members of the public raised the following issues – The junction at Ham Bridge (from Shelsley Walsh) needs the vegetation cutting back. Also the metal fence is completely obscured by trees. Clerk to report to Highways. The stones under the Conker tree have drifted everywhere. Can it be tidied up and then held back using mono blocks? Cllr Bowden to look at options with the Tree Surgeon and R. Wilks. The footpath along the side of the village green – any update re ownership? Cllr Bowden confirmed that he had met with the Highways Liaison Officer, and it appears to belong to Highways. A full response is awaited. It was also suggested that the PC establish ownership of the village green as it seems unclear and may also be Highways land? Noted that the 'no parking' sign was erected in 1936 by order of the PC. Clerk to look into this.

District & County Councillor Reports: Any written reports received will be circulated and uploaded to the website. Cllr Paul Cumming reported on MHDC planning matters including enforcement and appeals process, the 5-year land supply, the SWDPR and the Infrastructure Plan created to use Government funding. The recent accident on Clifton Hill was discussed, including the time it took for an ambulance to arrive. Some A&E improvements are expected next year to reduce waiting times. It was noted that West Mids Ambulance Service sometimes send vehicles via Whitbourne rather than use the better route via Bromyard Downs / Stourport Rd to get to the village. It was suggested that the Clerk notify the WMAS about the preferred route. The meeting noted the new housing development that had been granted on appeal at Martley, which means that local infrastructure will be placed under increased pressure.

Financial & Governance Matters: Payments approved as per the schedule-proposed Cllr Gilbert, seconded Cllr Merrick. All agreed. Councillor co-option – further to an application made, it was proposed by Cllr Bowden, seconded Cllr Merrick, that Sid Haywood be co-opted to the PC. All agreed. The Chairman welcomed Cllr Haywood to the meeting. The Clerk will notify MHDC.

Parish Matters / Updates: Village Maintenance Plan – hanging baskets are in place and Cllr Gilbert has responded to a resident's enquiry. Cllr Brooks raised concern regarding the state of the grass verge on the left-hand side going out of Clifton towards Tenbury, where it is very overgrown. There is currently a water pipe above ground waiting to be buried. The Clerk was asked to speak to the Lengthsman to clear the grass. There are some issues with the developer / contractors currently and Highways are also involved with the verge. Cllr Brooks

will draft a letter for the Clerk to send. Cllr Bowden has asked WCC to approach local farmers to install gates where there are currently stiles, but some farmers aren't keen to do it. (They may retain a stile if they wish to.) If new fencing has been installed then a gate must be installed. Cllr Bowden will progress works on existing stiles, to improve them for users. Hill Farm – s31 notices have been erected re footpaths not on maps. Maps need to be brought up to date. This does not affect existing public rights of way. The new footpaths map looks very good and also includes a QR code so maps can be accessed via mobile phones. Cllr Bowden reported from the recent WCC Highways walkabout that the footpath on the church side at the Anchorage is to be repaired at the end of August. Kenelm Close is also to be resurfaced. The 30 mph in Pound Lane may be relocated further down the lane (to be confirmed). Community Speed Watch - still awaiting speed data cables from WCC Highways for more data to be analysed. Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) – a re-quote for a solar powered option has been re-quoted as £3k for the monitor and £650 for the solar panel. The VAS coming in from Martley may need to be replaced. Matter to be placed on the next agenda. Cllr Bowden to circulate the quote received. Pavilion plumbing works are now completed.

Section 106 Matters: Four Acre Field (CFAF) Project – a revised application has been submitted to MHDC for consideration. Contractor letters are to be sent out next week. Cllr Bowden to liaise with the Clerk. Cllr Merrick is undertaking a species survey on site (twice a month survey from January to date). It looks to be a fantastic site, but it could do with a 2m boundary around the edge to encourage species. The Clerk was asked to remind R. Wilks. Cllr Merrick will circulate a report to the Council for consideration at the next PC meeting.

Planning Matters: Planning notification - M/23/00291/FUL - Blue Shot, Pound Lane, Clifton upon Teme WR6 6DE - approval of variation of conditions 4,5,11,12 & 18 on planning permission 21/01227/FUL - proposed residential development of 5 dwellings.

Highways & Facilities Matters: No further updates. Cllr Brooks has circulated the Shelsley Walsh closures as agreed. Road closures as circulated.

Councillors Reports & Items for Future Agendas: Cllr Brooks is to contact R. Wilks regarding play equipment and the RoSPA report 2023.

Next meeting: Thurs 7 September 2023 at 7:40pm





Church Matters

Summer's passing... Autumn's arriving. Schools are starting back, fields and hedgerows are changing colour, farmers are busy harvesting, hauling and cultivating. As we reflect over the seasons of this past year, there will have been all sorts of change in our own lives. Perhaps a new grandchild, a new job, a new term, an illness, a bereavement. Ebbs and flows, ups and downs. Change is all around us – at home, in our communities and in our three parish churches.

In Shelsley, we're growing our family-friendly monthly communion services 'with a twist'. After three years as excellent Church Warden, Jude Bettinson has handed the baton on to double-act Holly Perks and Kate Hurst. Harpley and Shelsley churches are exploring ways of using their buildings more flexibly, trialing removing some pews to enable wider use of the space. They have cleared and tidied their churchyards to allow greater bio-diversity and accessibility. At Harpley, there's a corner woodland area to enjoy some quiet moments' contemplation on your own or with others. St Kenelm's 'Warm Welcome' and the Toddler Group has created change for the better by bringing our communities together. It started as coffee, and then there were croissants, and that soon evolved into proper lunch too! It will resume on Thursday Sept 28th.

There's change too in parish organisation. This autumn, Clifton, Shelsley and Harpley will join Rev Julia Curtis' Teme Valley South group of churches, as part of the Rural Mission Area to be created with Teme Valley North group and the Wyre Forest group.
