## FATHER AND DAUGHTER'S FUNDRAISING KILIMANJARO CLIMB



Clifton's Neil Sparey and daughter Tabitha Hedges set out for Africa last month to climb Africa's highest mountain, Kilimanjaro, to raise funds for local good causes.

Tabitha (34) has already raised nearly £2,500 for her three-year-old daughter Hattie's pre-school, the Clifton upon Teme Nursery, while 63-year-old Neil is raising money for St Richard's Hospice where two of his close friends, Dave House and Rob Grove, were cared for.

"I have always loved hills and mountains and had hoped one day to be able to attempt to climb Mount Kilimanjaro," said Tabitha before the climb. "I just needed a reason to do it and that reason is my daughter and her amazing pre-school. I'll be trekking through four different climate zones (rainforest, moorland, alpine meadows, and arctic desert) and will be pushing my limits both physically and mentally, trekking up to 12 hours a day. It's a long way up, 5,895 meters (19,340 feet) above sea level! Along with a long climb, we also have the altitude to contend with, of course six nights on the floor under canvas and no showers."

## CLIFTON RESIDENTS OPPOSE PLAN FOR 55 MORE HOUSES



The plan to build another 55 houses on land in Hope Lane, Clifton, outside the existing development boundary of the village has met with opposition from local residents.

In a letter to Malvern Hills District Council's planning department, the Parish Council expressed a number of concerns regarding the application by developer TerraStrategic: the proposed site is prime arable land outside the agreed development area in the Neighbourhood Plan; the current transport infrastructure is inadequate; existing water and sewage provision issues, and the Chantry School in Martley is at full capacity.

The letter added: "It is a contentious issue and a significant proportion of the villagers attended two recent Parish Council meetings to speak against it, in some cases with detailed objections."



Members of the Clifton Sustainable Heritage Steering Group (CSHSG), opposed to the proposed development of 55 new houses in Clifton.

In addition, nearly 70 local residents have lodged objections with Malvern Hills District Council. Meanwhile, a number of them have formed the Clifton Sustainable Heritage Steering Group with the intention of employing a professional planning consultant.

"We have mobilised resources to actively engage with local planning authorities to ensure that the voices of Clifton's residents are heard and that any development respects the historical and environmental integrity of the cherished community," said Steering Group member James Lewis.

### SHELSLEY GRANGE PLAN LATEST

70 formal objections to plans for an events/wedding venue and car park at Shelsley Grange have been made by Shelsleys residents to Malvern Hills District Council.

Malvern Hills District Council's planning enforcement team has investigated a complaint that a new track was being built to provide car access to the menage/proposed new car park. The owner's agent agreed to cease work and if the application is refused, a separate application will be required for the new track or the land needs to be returned to its previous condition. Dame Harriett Baldwin MP has raised the matter with Malvern Hills District Council.

The planning officer will form her opinion now the consultation period has ended and write a report with her recommendation which will be sent to councillors who will then be asked whether they are happy to accept the recommendation or wish the matter to be referred to the planning committee. District Councillors Paul and Pam Cumming have been kept fully appraised of the objections.

Worcestershire County Council, as the Highway Authority, has also submitted a formal objection to the planning application, stating that 'the site is in an unsustainable location with no access to public transport'.

### COLUMN BY DAME HARRIETT BALDWIN MP

Parliament has returned after the Summer break and it is certainly a different looking House of Commons to the one when I was first elected in 2010. For the first time, I represent the official Opposition and my primary duty in the House of Commons will be to hold the Government to account. Having previously been a Minister for Africa, I am pleased to be taking a role shadowing the International Development Ministers — it is something I care passionately about and will scrutinise the new Government's policies and actions closely.



I'm also going to be speaking up for many of the concerns constituents are already raising with me – the impact of taking Winter Fuel Payments away from pensioners and there's a Budget looming at the end of next month with threats of tax hikes to pay for public sector pay deals. Many of you have written to me about the impact of adding VAT to school fees and this will have a huge impact on schools in my constituency – Malvern College, Bredon and Malvern St James as well as King's and the Worcester RGS in the city and risks directly impact both jobs and the local economy. The Budget is also casting a large shadow over local affairs. I am worried that a penny-pinching Labour Chancellor will take a fresh look at the promised investment in Tenbury Wells's much needed permanent flood defences.

I've already raised this in the House of Commons but I'm really concerned about Labour's plan to impose thousands more homes in West Worcestershire and relax planning restrictions to allow solar farms, windfarms and electricity pylons to be built across our beautiful rural countryside. I have always been concerned that Labour does not understand the important of the rural economy, the protection of our farming land and preserving our rural green spaces. I'll be doing what I can to make sure your voices are heard.




## COUNTRY MUSIC EVENING IN CLIFTON

## **Draft Minutes of Shelsley Parish Council Meeting 10 September**

Declaration of Interests. None. Public Questions. One, see Planning.

**Minutes:** The minutes of the meeting held on July 9th 2024 were amended to include Carole Warren as being present. The minutes were then agreed as a true record and signed by the Chairwoman.

The County Councillor report is available on the website. District Councillors Pam & Paul Cumming were present gave a report and answered questions. Midland Automobile Club: Councillor Hutton had liaised with MAC but there were no issues to report from either side. The Parish Clerk had received an email regarding Hill Climb traffic on Fetterlocks Lane, but it was deemed to not require further action, as preventative action is already being taken with road signage.

**Highways and Footpaths:** Lengthsman: No time sheets, invoices or reports have been received. A copy of the lengthsman's contract was circulated before the meeting. The lengthsman will be asked to take on a more proactive role with regular inspections particularly of drains in the parish.

The Parish Paths Warden arranged for a fallen oak tree to be removed from blocking a path. WCC did this as it was too precarious for the Warden and her helpers. Councillor Metcalfe also provided advice on the Public Right of Way which goes through Shelsley Grange.

**Urgent Decisions**: M/24/00979/FUL Shelsley Grange use of land as an events venue. The Clerk in consultation with the councillors submitted to MHDC that the Parish Council strongly objected to the proposal.

Planning: MHDC Planning Decisions.

 $\,$  M/24/00694/HP and M/24/00695/LB Post Office Shelsley Walsh. Single storey extension. Approved.

Shelsley Grange Enforcement report: The Parish Council informed the Enforcement Department at MHDC of possible unauthorised works taking place at Shelsley Grange. District Councillor Cumming reported that to his knowledge MHDC Enforcement Department had received three complaints. These include: Works on the listed barn, the pathway being constructed on the bridleway, and building works to the main house. There is currently a desist notice on the path to the manège. A noise assessment has now been requested by MHDC.

**Village Hall:** The Parish Council has on numerous occasions asked to view the Village Hall Management Accounts for 22-23. It was informed that the accounts would be available at the VHMC AGM the date of which was never conveyed to the Parish Council despite many requests. Consequently, none of the six Parish Councillors who are not on the VHMC attended.

The Chairman of the VHMC Councillor Stinton was invited to explain. He stated that Councillors were not satisfied with the summary of accounts previously submitted for 2022 2023. The full accounts for 2022 2023 were not ready until the AGM where they were available to view. The meeting was advertised nine days in advance by a notice at the Village Hall. No parish councillors attended other than those who also sit on the VH committee. When asked if the Parish Councillors could now see those accounts the answer was that the VHMC is not willing to provide them.

The Conveyance Document of 1960 states that as the Parish Council are the Custodian Trustees the annual accounts should be made available to it. The Chairman of the VHMC replied it was not known whether the document is still relevant.

The non VHMC members spoke to register their dismay at the behaviour of the VHMC who on a number of occasions had been asked when the AGM was to take place, no reply was received from any of the VHMC members. The Chairman of the VHMC maintained their only duty was to place the notice of the meeting and their single notice was placed nine days in advance. As a result of the poor advertising of the AGM 99% of the parish residents were excluded from attending. Village Hall Trustee meetings are held in private with no public notice.

A motion was put forward Motion: This Parish Council will refer the three Parish Councillors on the VHMC for non-compliance of the Code of Conduct with regard to the lack of transparency, honesty, respect and the interests of the local community in relation to the communications for the VHMC AGM.

A second motion was proposed: Motion: The PC would like to be in a position to support financially the VHMC but will not until such time that the VHMC provides the PC with their annual accounts.

The Chairman of the VHMC stated at a subsequent meeting to the AGM the Parish Council representative did not attend or send apologies. The VHMC did not want to coopt her and do not want any involvement from anyone on the Parish Council.

**Speeding Issues**: Councillor Belfield is currently undertaking a review of speeding in the parish. He will report at the next meeting.

#### **Speeding Signs:**

Additional signage would be beneficial and the purchase and position of signs was discussed however as the Clerk advised that insurance may be an issue, it was decided to approach WCC for pictorial warning signs.

Worcestershire County Council will be requested to position flood warning signs and poles to mark the depth of flood water between All Saints' and New Mill Bridge.

#### Point of Order:

The election of the MAC liaison Councillor was raised. A Councillor was concerned due procedure had not been observed. He was assured that it had.


