

Finally, the cuckoo has been heard by a resident of Harpley, the first time for many years. Has anyone else heard it?



THE LONGEST DAY... AND AN EVEN LONGER RIDE!

The longest day of the year, Saturday 21 June, will seem even longer for Clifton biker, Darren Watkins who will hit the road with serious intent as he tackles a ride from Land's End to John O'Groats in memory of his late father, Cyril Watkins to raise money for Cancer Research UK.

The 'Longest Day Challenge' was launched in 2018 by Performance Bikes magazine. Riders have a spending limit of $\pounds600$ to buy their bikes, and the route, which is almost 1,000 miles, is restricted to the use of A and B roads (no motorways) using a mapped-out route.

Darren's machine is a 1999, T-reg Triumph 955 Sprint. "I'm doing this to



The physical challenges of this popular event are carefully monitored, with five checkpoints on the route. Trackers are fitted to all riders and a support vehicle is in place. In 2017, Darren raised money by completing the Welsh 3000 in memory of his mum who he lost to ovarian cancer. "I was astonished then by people's generosity, and I'm now asking for people to dig deep again via my JustGiving page." His sponsors will have a white sticker placed on his bike in their memory, and anyone celebrating their success against cancer will have a yellow one on there.



Church Matters

As I sit and write this article, I find it hard to believe it is for the June edition, has ever a year gone so quickly? And within those past months it seems so much has happened in the world. We had the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury, a new president of the USA



sworn in, the death of Pope Francis, the election of Pope Leo IV, and who amongst us can forget the VE celebrations and that memorable service at Westminster Abbey, and not forgetting here in our own village the opening of the Clifton Recreation Ground by Marie Thompson.

How, too, the Church's year is moving on. For the fifty days of Easter we bathed in the glory of Christ's resurrection. In song and word, music and text, our churches resounded with gladness, and, in so doing, joined not only with churches across the world, but blended with the endless voice of all creation; the universe danced with the power of Christ risen, ascended, glorified. At this time we are lifted into eternity and heaven as we joined in the triumphant song, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia! Words and music we heard spoken, and ringing around our churches during Eastertide.

On the 8 June the church celebrates the great feast of Pentecost, often described as the beginning of the Christian Church, as well as the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples, and fulfilling Jesus' promise. What happened at Pentecost we can never maybe fully understand, but something tremendous did happen. Pentecost marks the official beginning of the disciples' mission to spread the gospel. The Holy Spirit blesses and comforts us all, and we can find a sure hope in that. Enjoy the summer, and happy and restful
