CLIFTON FILM MARKS BATTLE OF BRITAIN ANNIVERSARY

The screening of the film *Love, Laughter, Loss* at Clifton Village Hall on **Thursday, 6 November**, also marks the anniversary of the Battle of Britain in World War 2.



The film features a young WAAF (Women's Auxiliary Air Force) officer, Patricia Rickman, who served at RAF Middle Wallop aerodrome in the summer and autumn of 1940 at the same time as my godfather, 20-year-old Pilot Officer Charles Overton, was there with 609 Squadron whose Spitfires were battling with incoming German aircraft.

Patricia Rickman was the mother of Alexandra Winnington from Shelsley Beauchamp. She kept a wealth of photographs and newspaper cuttings of her service during WW2 in leatherbound albums and it is these, combined with the stories she told her family, that inspired Alexandra's brother Rory MacColl to produce the film that so evocatively captures the spirit of the time.

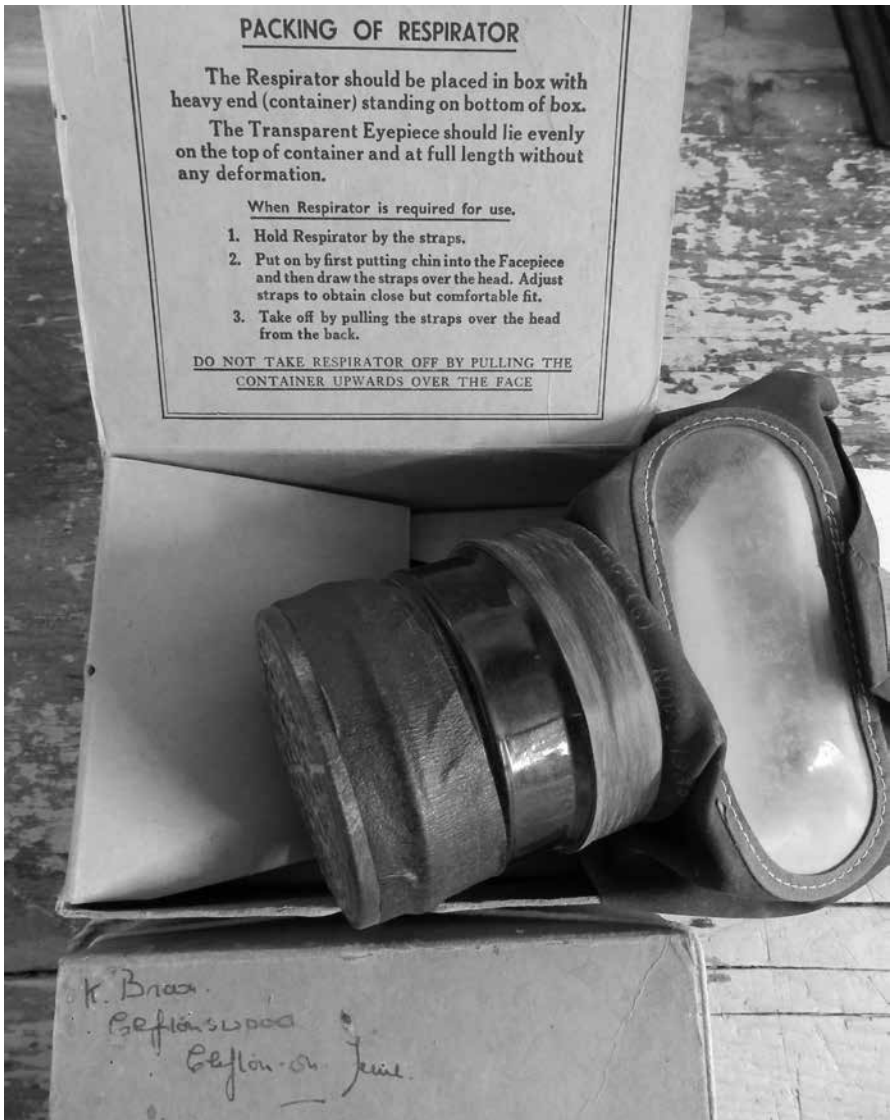
"Rory collected the albums from me and looked through them very carefully during 2023 and then the British Legion asked him to make a film about our mother's story," says Alexandra.

Sadly, Rory MacColl did not live to see the completed film which had its premiere screening earlier this year.

WW2 GAS MASKS RETURN TO CLIFTON



Two Second World War gas masks, issued to Kenneth Brown and his wife Enid in 1938, who farmed Cliftonswood Farm at the beginning of the war, have been returned to Clifton by a lady in South Wales who bought them on eBay and has donated them to the History Room in the village.

Kenneth Brown was born in 1901 and went to work at Hill Farm which was occupied by the Richards family in the 1920s. He married Enid Richards in 1933 and the couple had a son, Harry, who took over Cliftonswood Farm until his death in 2015.

In the years leading up to WWII, there was a significant fear that Germany would attack the UK with poison gas. The British government issued respirators (gas masks) to every man, woman, and child, with over 40 million masks distributed by 1938. Though never used in an attack on Britain, they became a common symbol of wartime life and the threat of aerial bombardment.

The masks are made of black rubber and contain a filter that is a significant source of danger. The civilian gas masks predominantly contain asbestos filters, which were effective at absorbing gases but posed a severe health hazard over time. They were extremely hot, smelly, and uncomfortable to wear, with the rubber and disinfectant often making people feel sick.

Abbreviated draft minutes of Clifton Parish Council meeting held Thursday 2 October 2025 at Clifton Village Hall

Present: Cllr J. Bowden (Chair), Cllrs P. Brooks, R. Neave, and S. Haywood.

Apologies: Damon Crawshaw, Angie Griffiths. District Cllr Paul Cumming and County Cllr Justin Bowen.

Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held 4 September: Approved subject to changes raised by Cllr Brooks. Cllr Neave raised query about Parish Council comments regarding forthcoming Planning Appeal. Clerk responded that the portal was inaccessible so comments were sent by email instead. Cllr Bowden said he would be attending the appeal on 14 October. Cllr Neave stated that he may also attend. Cllr Brooks asked about VAS. They have been delivered and are currently with the Lengthsman.

Public Time: Nothing raised.

District & County Councillors Reports (circulated via email): Report received from Cllr Bowen.

Discussion around speeding through the village. Highways stance is that changes to speed limits or signage is triggered by an incident or series of incidents. The Parish Council supports Cllr Bowen's objective of giving parish councils more influence over setting speed limits.

Financial & Governance Matters: Payment schedule will be recirculated as Lengthsman's invoice has been received. Upcoming Expenditure: Gazebos have not been purchased yet. The purchase was approved in previous meeting. Aqua Cleansing have sent an invoice. If agreed this will need to be paid before work is carried out. Cllr Bowden proposed cutting back of Rowan trees near Football Pitch. Cost £120. Seconded by Cllr Brooks. Parish Clerk highlighted that parish laptop does not support Windows 11 and so a new laptop will need to be purchased. Approximate cost £450. Parish Clerk to purchase and be reimbursed. Cllr Bowden proposed and Cllr Brooks seconded. Cllr Bowden proposed spending £165.50 on A3 map of the village outlining land owned by Highways. Seconded by Cllr Neave. Review of statutory and financial documentation (date to be decided). Meeting to be held discussing and agreeing on current documentation such as Standing Orders, Financial Regulations, Risk Assessments and Asset Register. Additionally, Councillors will need to consider 'Except for matters' as raised by the external auditor. Meeting date to be agreed.

Parish Matters / Updates: Tree on Clifton Hill removed. Resurfacing on Old Road including new signage. Ham Bridge railings replaced. New signs for the recreational ground due to be delivered. Hope Lane road closure causing minimal disruption. Cllr Bowden proposed to change water provider from Water Plus to EverFlow. Seconded by Cllr S Haywood. Vegetation on pavement near village shop. Lengthsman to cut it back. County Highways have raised an issue

surrounding unauthorized road closure. Possibly related to Remembrance Day and Scouts / Guides walking from Pavillion to the Church. More information required as Parish Council not aware of road closure. Tenbury Police notified of vandalism at Recreation Ground. Cllr Brooks highlighted that the footpath near Saxon Close has weather damage. This will be reported via the portal.

Playing Field (CFAF) project update: Cllr Bowden said contractors are working on the playground on the 23 October. New see-saw will be installed. Ground underneath swings will need to be seeded for grass to grow through matting. Alternative will be investigated. A-frame will be removed. Tractor refurbishment will cost approximately £3,000. Councillors to consider alternatives.

Planning Matters: Nothing received. Strategic Planning updates: SWDPR update due in November.

Highway Matters – Lengthsman tasks: Matters to be referred to Cllr Bowen – Footpath near Saxon Close. Road and footpath closure notices circulated on website.

Councillors Reports & Items for Future Agendas: Cllr Neave raised Christmas event planning, etc. To be added to the next agenda. Cllr Bowden will liaise with former 'Carols on the Green' organiser.

Date of next meeting: Thursday 6 November 2025 at 7.40pm in the Village Hall.

STATEMENT BY CLIFTON PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN

Responding to allegations that Clifton Parish Council has not followed proper procedure, Chairman John Bowden told last month's meeting that he welcomed participation from any and all residents of the village.

"The role of any Parish Council is to spend a small amount of your Council Tax on items which would not be apparent to District and County Councils," he said. "According to my Council Tax bill it costs each household in the region of £1.90p."

"We have no power at all, contrary to some popular opinions, as demonstrated by the last two planning applications. We rejected the application for 55 houses in Hope Lane; Malvern Hills planners initially supported it. We supported the application for self-build houses in Pound Lane and Malvern Hills rejected it. Several allegations were made that we were not following Council procedure and not applying the Nolan principals. That was some 12 weeks ago. We still await any formal complaint."

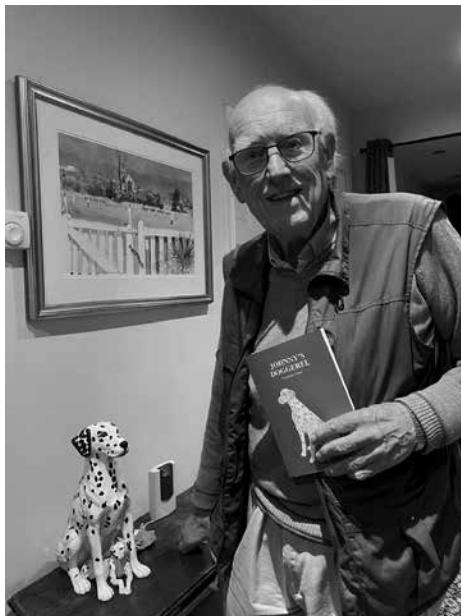
JOHNNY'S DOGGEREL

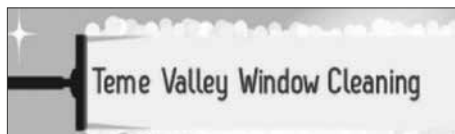

HARPLEY HARVEST FESTIVAL



St Bartholomew's Church, Harpley, has been presented with a special plaque in recognition of its active support for the Sustainable Church Flowers campaign. The plaques were launched last month at the SCF Clergy Conference event at the Chapel Royal, St James's Palace.

St Bartholomew's is the founder church of the SCF movement and was responsible for setting up the committee that organised the conference. The plaque was presented to Dot Millward (*pictured*), a founding member of the SCF movement in Harpley at the Harvest Service there by Rev Canon David Hewlett, Chair of the diocesan Climate Crisis Task Group.

"The essence of the movement is to avoid the use of single-use plastics including floral foam and to use seasonal and local flowers as far as possible," said Shane Connolly, the originator of the movement. "Floral foam is not yet 100% compostable and cannot be put safely on the churchyard compost heap. In its place the traditional use of water in vases with various techniques of twigs, chicken wire and imaginative use of building materials."
